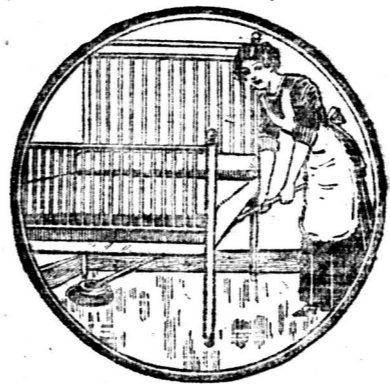
## J. H. MISNER

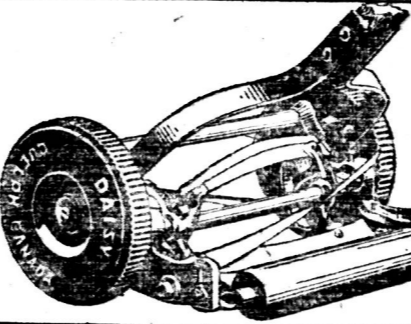
