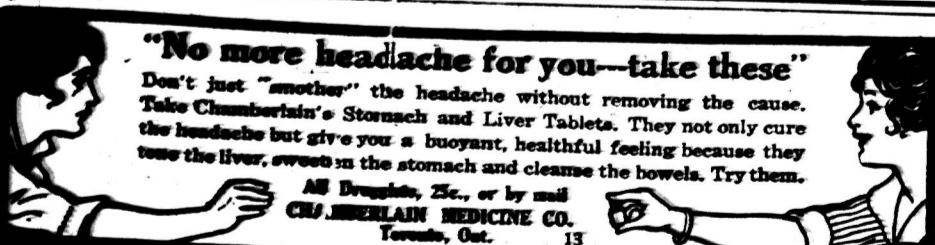

Jarvis, May 15, 1915.

The local Board of Health of the Township of Walpole met in the Council Chamber, village of Jarvis, pursuant to a call by the Chairman.

The following members were present:—W. D. Roulston, Dr. Jaques, medical health officer, George Easton, and the Secretary.

W. D. Roulston presided and the minutes of the last meeting were read and adopted. Moved by George Easton, seconded by W. D. Roulston, and resolved that the medical health officer and E. J. Beam, sanitary inspector, visit all slaughter houses and butter factories south of the stage road in the Township of Walpole, and the medical health officer and Edward Geovan, sanitary inspector, visit all butter factories and slaughter houses to the north of the said stage road in the said township, the inspection to be done as soon as possible and report to the Board of Health.

—Carried. Moved by Dr. Jaques, seconded by George Easton, and resolved, that the local Board of Health do now adjourn to meet at the call of any member of the Board.

—Carried. Vokes—Morrow, and resolved, that this Council purchase from the Council of the Village of Jarvis, one road grader, at and for the sum of \$150.

—Carried. Vokes—Clark and resolved that this municipality heartily endorse the Hydro Electric Railway programme as outlined in the Memorial presented to the Honourable Mr. Hurst and the Provincial Government, on Friday, the 26th of March, 1915, by a deputation representing the majority of the Municipalities of Ontario.

And that as the construction of said Electric Railways will not only give transportation facilities that at the present time are entirely inadequate to the needs of the province, but will also furnish an easy and inexpensive means of supplying parts of the province with Hydro Electric Light and Power that would otherwise be largely denied these advantages, we respectfully urge that your Honourable Government favorably consider the request contained in said Memorial, and grant to such roads a subsidy of \$2,500 a mile.

And that as the Memorial sets forth that any subsidy granted will not be needed for some time and will only be required as roads are constructed we respectfully urge that your Honourable Government make a pronouncement on this question as speedily as possible, in order that a part of the work may be proceeded with at once, believing that this will do much towards restoring public confidence.

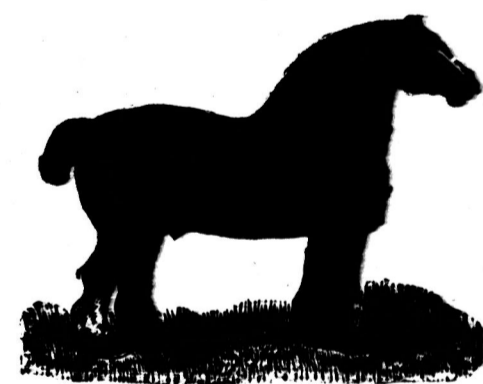
