PROFESSION OF BRAVE
Remarkable War Story. Has Been Widely Told in England.

A correspondent recently returned from the front, wounded, tells a striking story of an officer's premonition of approaching death. The question of premonitions is always of the deepest interest to psychologists, and although many stories are current of people possessing this mysterious sense of foreknowledge it is very rarely indeed that they can be verified. The truth of the following incident is vouched for by the writer, whose story, in his own words, was as follows: "My company captain was a regular 'sport,' a fine man in every respect. He was a typical commonsense Englishman, and there was nothing sentimental or fanciful about him. The very fact that he was such a normal everyday type of man makes what I have to relate seem all the more queer. He took a liking to me, and I knocked about a lot with him in France. Wherever he went I always accompanied him as escort. He used to talk quite freely to me, and treated me more like a friend than as a subordinate.

We were in the charge at... and our battalion marched up to the trenches the night before the attack. It was decided that the captain should have an escort of four bomb-charge, so as to give him a chance to look after the company. I was selected to be in charge of the escort and early in the morning before dawn he sent for me to his dug-out to give me my final instructions. When he had finished his instructions he added in a queer voice, "Keep close to me in the charge, lad." "I will, sir," I answered eagerly. He was silent for a few moments, and then, looking at me very gravely, said, "I shall go under in this charge." I was astonished beyond measure, because he was usually so cheery and optimistic in his talk. "Don't say that, sir," I cried, but he shook his head sadly and added, "I know it." Then he bent over me and kissed me, saying, "Good-bye, lad."

I must admit that when he kissed me a great fear came over me, for it was quite the last thing in the world I should have expected him to do. I knew then it was something more than a passing fit of despondency that prompted him to say what he did. I should have broken down and cried like a child if a sergeant had not come in just then with a message from the colonel. I never got a chance to speak to him again privately before the fight, and in one way I was glad it happened so. We charged about daybreak, after a short but terrific bombardment. The captain was as lively as a cricket while we were awaiting the order. He was "fags" round, and generally keeping things lively. The word came at last, and we scrambled over and made for the German lines. They greeted us with everything earthy—rifles, maxims, bombs—the whole packet. It was hell's delight getting across. We cleared them out of the stampering out to make for the second. He fell back, stone dead, without a murmur. It was instantaneous. I myself was wounded about an hour afterwards.
