Upon the recommendation of the Honourable the Minister of Public Works, the Committee of Council advise that pursuant to the provisions of Section 8 (2) of the Ontario Game and Fisheries Act, the hunting, taking or killing of ruffed grouse or partridge, black and grey squirrels, in the counties of Halton and Haldimand be prohibited for a period of three years from the 14th day of October, 1914.
