Bad Barn Fire

Mr. Elisha Farr, Jr., one of Norfolk's most progressive farmers, was the victim of a disastrous fire which broke out in his barn about three o'clock last Saturday morning. Mr. Farr lives in Lot 14th of the 3rd Concession of Woodhouse, about four miles east of Lynn Valley. For several days Mr. Farr had been busy with help three soldiers, obtained on furlough from Col. Pratt, in getting in his crops, and there were in the two barns that were consumed, 20 loads of hay, 80 loads of alsike, 300 bushels of wheat and nearly seven hundred dollars worth of implements.

About three o'clock Mr. Farr was awakened by the glare of flame shining into his room. Hurrying out he was in time to get out his horses and some of the implements. A wagon loaded with alsike standing on the gangway was destroyed.

The origin of the fire is not definitely known. Some of the neighbours blame the cigarette stubs of the soldiers. Mr. Farr himself calls attention to one peculiar fact. The barns were about ten feet apart at the nearest points, being set on an angle toward each other, yet when he discovered the blaze, the fire in both was aflame, though the fire had not burst through either roof. Both barns appeared to be roaring furnaces within.

One of the two barns was quite new, with all the modern conveniences. Together they constituted what was considered the most efficient barn equipment in the township. The Reformer heard a competent judge say that it would be impossible to replace the buildings alone for \$4,500. In addition to this there is considerable loss on contents. The insurance in the Waterloo Mutual, is \$2,000 on the buildings, \$1,000 on crops and \$500 on implements. —Simcoe Reformer.
