Cholera in Japan.
The watchfulness of the sanitary authorities in Japan in face of the cholera visitation is keeping the disease well in hand, despite the occurrence of fresh sporadic cases in places far apart. It is noticeable that most if not all new cases reported occur among those whose heads of families are seafaring men. The two cases in the suburbs of Tokio and the three at Saju are all sailors. Fishermen are frequent victims. Thirteen new cases at the port of Yokosuka, including five women created a scare here. A strict quarantine of 522 houses with 2,039 persons, 241 being seafarers, and a lobster was assigned as the carrier of one sufferer. The eating of sea fish is discouraged. WHY IS A BOX CAR?

A BOX car and a barn are both built to hold wheat and other grain, etc.; there the resemblance ceases, for the barn is intended to remain where it is put, whereas the box car's purpose in life is to keep moving and to travel as many times and as quickly as the railway companies are permitted to keep it working from shipper to consignee. Sometimes it happens that the consignee becomes a warehouseman, and converting the box car into a temporary warehouse, keeps stored in it all or part of the shipment of goods, for a considerable time, sufficient in the aggregate of all box cars of the temporary warehouse variety to cause a general car shortage for a time—thus creating much annoyance and inconvenience to the public that could have been avoided entirely had team work between shippers, consignees and the railway companies been the general practice. The result might be quite well expressed as a sum in arithmetic, thus:
Loading car to capacity + quick loading by shipper + quick transit by railway + quick unloading = prevention of car shortage, anywhere, any time.
