### Diamond Wedding

At Sandusk

Probably never in the history of this community has so unique an event taken place as the celebrating of the 70th anniversary of the marriage of Mr. and Mrs. Wm. Deal which took place at their home on Dec. 5th, 1916.

Mrs. Deal came from Norfolk County, Eng. in 1843, at the age of 13 and was united in marriage to Wm. Deal in 1866, who came from Sussex, Eng. in 1851, at the age of 20.

Mr. Deal is one of the early hardworking pioneers. For the first two or three years of his life in Canada he lived and worked for Mr. Jas. Butcher, 6th Concession, Walpole and helped in the Lardicoke and Springvale sawmills, sometimes known as the Jarvis sawmill. His memory is very clear in regard to his pioneer life, of which he never tires of telling his friends. Local remembrances how in 1858 a frost came killing the crops making it very hard to get enough flour to live on until the next crop ripened.

There are only two other pioneers still living who were in these parts when Mr. Deal first settled here, namely, Jno. Sault, of Pt. Dover, aged 87, and John McMillen, age 90, who during the summer months lives with his daughter, Mrs. Jas. Bush, near Mr. Deal.

With the exception of about two years Mr. and Mrs. Deal have spent all their life in the township of Walpole.

They were blessed with two sons and three daughters, all of whom grew to womanhood, but later being called upon to mourn the loss of three daughters and one son, the surviving son, John, living with his parents on the homestead. Six grandchildren and eleven great grandchildren are descendents from them, nearly all of whom were present at the Family Re-union on the 60th anniversary.

"It is said the glory and contentment of the home is hospitality and contentment. In these two respects surely their home has excelled for they have lived a quiet contented life, and in regard to their hospitality, a beautiful tribute was carelessly paid by a friend who said, "If Mr. Deal saw any one going along the road at noon, he would go out and invite them in to to dinner."

The debated question, "is marriage a failure," has surely been answered in the negative by their life. A friend calling to offer congratulations remarked, that sixty years was a long time to live with one person and immediately the old gentlemen paid a charming tribute to his aged wife by saying, "Yes, but I'm not tired of her yet."

The children and grand children presented them with two large comfortable looking chairs.

Mrs. John Deal, assisted by her daughters, Mrs. Hoebel of Jarvis, and Mrs. Clare Deal, of Pt. Dover, served lunch to friends who called to offer their congratulations.

It is the wish of their many friends that God's richest blessings may rest up on Mr. and Mrs. Deal until the end of their days.
