The following note on How to finish off the toe of socks being knitted for he soldiers by the ladies of the Halimand Sock Batt. will be of interest o the workers and satisfaction to the ommittee in charge.-

TOE-Divide the 63 stitches beween the three needles, 23 on each. stitches on each needle. 2nd ro-Knit together 2nd and 3rd

sti ches on each needle. 3rd row-Knit together 3rd and 4th sti: ches on each needle.

And so on, beginning again with st and 2nd stitches after reaching he last stitches on each needle. Decrease to nine stitches. Draw wool through stitches, and darn in carefully.
