Mr. and Mrs. James Bush spent Sunday with Mr. and Mrs. John Aude, Hagersville.

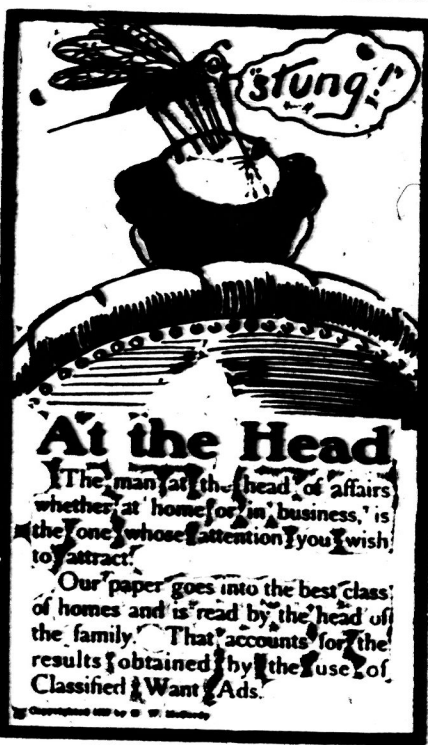
Mrs. Don Graydon and child returned home on Saturday to Hamilton after spending a week in this locality.

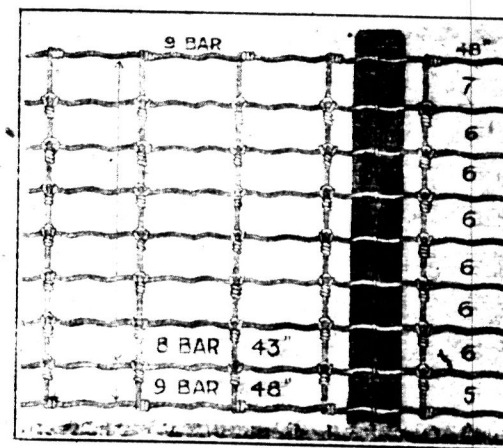
