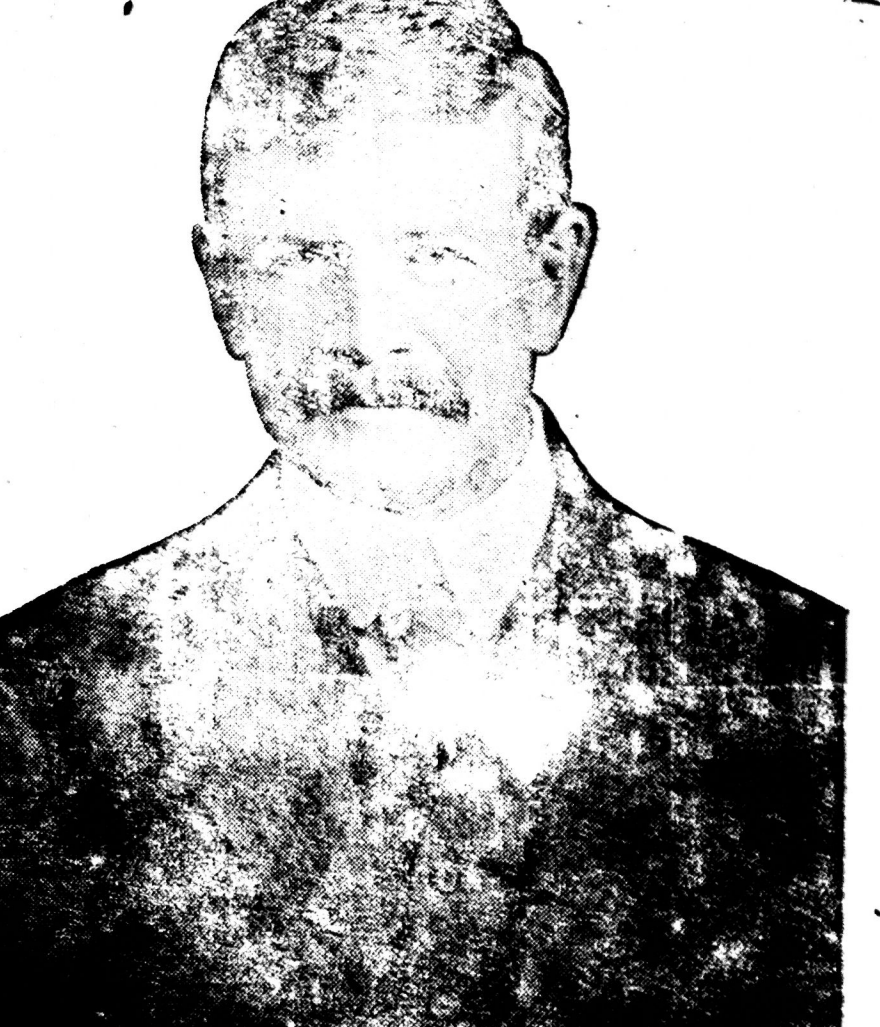

Mr. Stephen Leacock



CANADA as a rule very quickly loses her successful authors to the United States—Liss Carnal, for instance, or Arthur Stringer and C. G. D. Roberts—for the rewards of literature are greater there than here. But Stephen Leacock is still a Canadian citizen in spite of the international reputation he has gained by such publications as "Sunshine Sketches of a Little Town," or the "Adventures of the Idle Rich," or "Moonbeams of the Larger Lunacy." Montreal is his winter home, for he never fails to come back to Orillia, the little town of Ontario which he proud to claim him as her son. In the preface to "Sunshine Sketches" Stephen Leacock gives a delightful account of his early life, which only a sense or humor enabled him to survive. There are, however, many incidents in his career which are not recorded in this preface. The turn of the tide in his fortunes is said to be due to the lucky accident that the C. P. R. found it necessary to acquire the right of way through some land he had bought for a song. Stephen Leacock has the reputation of being as good an exponent of economics as he is a writer of humorous stories, and his lectures attract many students to the great University at Montreal.
