Farm Labor Supplied

The local office of the Department of Agriculture has just received assurance from the Bureau of Colonization that prospects are bright for supplying the demands of our farmers with a fairly good class of help. Agents of the Bureau of Colonization have been at work in the United States for sometime and report that single inexperienced men can be obtained for approximately \$25 a month on a year contract and approximately \$30 a month for terms of six months. Married men are asking from \$300 to \$360 per annum with free house and garden. There are also inexperienced men and boys at prices ranging from \$10 per month up.
