TOE-Divide the 69 stitches between the three needles, 23 on each. ist row-Knit together lat and 2nd stitches on each needle. 2nd ro-Knit together 2nd and 3rd

stirches on each needle. 3rd row-Knit together 3rd and 4th stitches on each needle. And so 'en, beginning again with

1st and 2nd stitches after reaching the last stitches on each needle. Decrease to nine stitches. Draw wool through stitches, and darn in care-






