Hon. Dr. Reid announces that the Dominion Government has decided to grant a single-fare return rate on all government railways to all soldiers visiting their homes. Heretofore the rate has been one single fare and one third. This rate has been applied on the Intercolonial as well as on all other railways in Canada. The Government railways now take the lead in reducing the fare.

The astounding prices that gasoline has reached are beginning to alarm the users of it, many of whom were under the impression that the war was the cause of the increase. The Los Angeles Record has studied the matter and says that increased consumption is not the cause of the increased price, but that every time the price of gasoline is raised an added dividend is handed over to the few who have the monopoly of the oil wells.

A newspaper is in no sense a child of charity. It earns twice over every dollar it receives and it is second to no enterprise in contributing to the upbuilding of a community. Its patrons read far more benefits from its pages than its publishers, and in calling for the support of the community in which it is published, it asks for no more than in all fairness belongs to it, though generally it receives less.

In Scotland a marriage is regarded absolutely as a civil contract; a man and a woman expressing themselves as husband and wife before two witnesses constitutes a legal marriage and an order to the sheriff causes it to be registered. Last year more than 4,000 such marriages took place. Such a marriage is perfectly legal, no question of succession of property is raised by its validity; no reproach of illegitimacy rests upon its issue.
