FOURTH MEETING—FIRST DAY
Council met at the call of the Warden. All members present except James Mc Alpine.

Minutes of last meeting were then read and adopted as read. —Carried.

Cpl. A. T. Thompson, thanking Council for grant to 114th Battalion.

Department of Public Highways, re proposed county expenditure.
Clerks of Norfolk, Welland, Brant and Wentworth, re auctioneers' licenses.

Held & Son re placing gasoline equipment on the street.
Pyle-Ingles—That Messrs. Bradford Hart and Stewart be a special committee on communications. —Carried.

Ingles-Pyle—That a grant of \$20 be made for beautifying the Court House grounds and that the same be expended under the supervision of Mr. Thomas Walsh. —Carried.

Pyle-Ingles—That we do now resume business with the Warden in the chair. —Carried.

Bain-Patton—That a by-law be introduced and read a first time for the purpose of diverting a sum of money for recruiting purposes from the sum voted to the 114th Batt. for equipment. —Carried.

TENDERS FOR DREDGING.

SEALED TENDERS, addressed to the undersigned and endorsed "Tender for Dredging, Port Maitland" will be received at this office until 4.00 P. M., on Tuesday, May 20, 1916, for dredging required at Port Maitland, Ontario.

Tenders will not be considered unless made on the forms supplied, and signed with the actual signatures of tenderers.

Combined specification and form of tender can be obtained on application to the Secretary, Department of Public Works, Ottawa. Tender must include the towing of the plant to and from the work.

The greater portion of this work will be required to be done by an hydraulic dredge.

The dredges and other plant which are intended to be employed on this work shall have been duly registered in Canada at the time of the filing of the tender with the Department, or shall have been built in Canada after the filing of the tender.

Contractors must be ready to begin work immediately upon notification of the acceptance of their tender.

Each tender must be accompanied by an accepted cheque on a chartered bank, payable to the order of the Honourable the Minister of Public Works, for five per cent (five per cent) of the contract price, but no cheque to be for less than fifteen hundred dollars, which will be forfeited if the person tendering declines to enter into a contract when called upon to do so or fail to complete the work contracted for, if the tender be not accepted the cheque will be returned.
