TOE\_Divide the 60 stitches between the three needles, 23 on each. 1st row-Knit together 1st and 2nd stitutes on each needle. 2nd re-Knit together 2nd and 3rd stitches on each needle.
3rd row-Knit together 3rd and 4th

stitches on each needle. And co on, beginning again with ist and 2nd stitches after reaching the last stitches on each needle. Dese to nine stitches. Draw wool through stitches, and darn in care-


