FESTIVAL of ROSES

THE world has been invited to Portland for the opening of the Tenth Annual Rose Festival in the second week in June. Millions of rose flowers will be on review to send forth their delightful fragrance, a fitting welcome for the guests from every land.

Portland, which Canadians can reach by way of the Canadian Pacific Railway, is this year talking roses so that the tourist can enjoy the wonderful scenery Canada offers as well as appreciating the festival. The annual *Festa* is probably one of the best demonstrations of community spirit in the country. The Oregon metropolis each year produces more than 25,000,000 rose flowers, having been specializing on this Queen of Flowers for over 20 years.

During this festival week the Peninsula Park is one mammoth rose garden where more than 1,000,000 roses covering 700 varieties are in bloom at one time. It is said that if the rose bushes in Portland were placed in one great hedge it would reach from Winnipeg to Glacier, B.C., in the Canadian Pacific Railway, over a thousand miles. This year right in the heart of the business section two park blocks will be transformed into a downtown rose garden featuring roses and other beautiful flowers. It will have as its attraction a rose fountain consisting of 15,000 "Dainty Fuchsia" roses. It will be the first fountain of the kind ever built in the United States. Paris exhibited a similar fountain at the 1900 Exposition but Portland's rose festival fountain will be twice as large.

"For you a rose in Portland grows" is the slogan for this year's festival and Oregon's chief city is sending forth this poetic reminder that there grows a rose in Portland each year for all the visitors on the three *Festa* days.

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
