With proper astention to details, a useful reputation for Canadian poultry can be established on the British market this year. It is of the greatest importance therefore, that all poultsy marketed be well finished, well bled and dressed and packed in the most attractive manner possible.

TISCOUNT BRYCE endorses the recent speech of Viscount Grey before the Foreign Press Association in approval of the League of Peace idea, in the following letter to The

"A point upon which I desire to say a word is the question mentioned by Viscount Grey-are the neunations prepared to undertake and fulfil the responsibilities which the formation of a permanent league of peace after the war would impose upon each of those who joined

This question is, of course, especially important to the greatest of neutral nations, the nation from whose statesmen comes the suggestion of such a league, agreeing in principle with what Premier Asquith said two years ago. No one can venture at this moment to predict what the opinion and action of the people of the United States will be after the war is ended, for only then can that question arise in practical form.

"I wish to point out the intense

'No dissent to these views has, so far as I know, come from any responsible quarter in America. It is the one point mentioned in the presidential election campaign concerning which no disagreement has arisen. Ought not these declarations to be welcomed by public opinion in this country as it was welcomed by Viscount Grey? Do they not suggest that as soon as the end of the war is in sight we should endeavor, in conjunction with the distinguished statesmen who are leading the movement in America, to consider how such a league may be formed and what shall be its functions? 'The obstacles are great, but the gain if they be overcome is inestimable. If the risks of war and the preparations for war are to be in Europe for the next thirty years what they have been for the last thirty, dark indeed is the prospect for mankind. 
