### County Council—Concluded

Cayuga, Oct. 17, 1916.  
REPORT of the Home Committee to the Warden and Members of the County Council.  
Gentlemen—We your Home Committee beg leave to submit the following report: There are 31 inmates in the Home, 12 females and 19 males. We have had three deaths since our last report—Jacob Starnaman, T. Fitzpatrick and M. Logan. The county was to no expense with M. Logan's funeral, his friends burying him. Sold the Jacob Starnaman property to William Bate for \$500. and received cheque for that amount and deposited the cheque with Mr. L. Werner, the County Treasurer. We sold the milk wagon wagon of Jacob Starnaman to Freeman for \$3. and deposited the money with the County Treasurer. On Oct. 11 we received notice from the Manager of the Home, Mr. Brown that they had had a fire. I went and made an investigation and found the pig pen, hen house and straw stack burned. I notified the agent, Mr. Shepard, at once the adjuster who came and the matter is under adjustment, and we will make a full report at the next meeting of the Council.  
We, your Home Committee, recommend the County Council to put a hydrant near to the Home, as the one at present is too far away. We would also recommend the pig pen and hen house to be rebuilt as soon as possible. We have examined carefully the vouchers of the different accounts for maintenance, compared them with the accounts and find them correct. We would refer the same to the Finance Committee for payment.
