Gentlemen—We the members of your Committee on the purchase of military outfit and equipment for the 114th Battalion, met at Cayuga on the above dates all the members present except Warden Holmes and also Major Cowie representing the said Battalion.

On motion of H. J. Pye and J. C. Inglis the following accounts were passed and the County Treasurer was instructed to make payment of same out of the appropriation under by-law 569.

The meeting was then adjourned. All of which is respectfully submitted J. C. Inglis, Chairman.

Hart-Bradford—That the report of the Committee on the purchase of Military outfit and equipment for the 114th Battalion be adopted as read.

Buckner-McAlpine—That the report of the Finance Committee be received and read.

Carried.  
Cayuga, August 15, 1916.  
To the Warden and Members of the County Council.

Gentlemen—We the members of your Finance Committee beg to report that we have examined the accounts and recommend same for payment.

We recommend further that the action of the Warden and Treasurer in signing a note for \$6000 to the Canadian Bank of Commerce to provide funds for payment of General Accounts be confirmed.

All of which is respectfully submitted, J. C. Inglis, Chairman.

Pyle-Hart—That the report of the Finance Committee be adopted as read.

Carried.  
Toohy-Hart—That the by-law be introduced and read a first time to borrow \$12,000 from Canadian Bank of Commerce as a temporary advance to pay for Construction on County Roads.

Carried.  
Toohy-Hart—That the by-law to borrow \$12,000 for County Roads be read a second time.

Carried.  
Hart-Inglis—That said by-law be read a third time, signed, sealed and entitled a by-law as in the original motion.

Carried.  
Bain-Clark—That a sum of \$4000 be taken up on the credit obtained by the County from the Canadian Bank of Commerce in Cayuga for construction purposes on County Roads and that the Warden and Treasurer sign a note for same.

Carried.  
Inglis-Roulston—That a by-law be introduced to borrow the sum of forty thousand from the Canadian Bank of Commerce for current expenses of the County and that the by-law be read a first time.

Carried.  
Roulston-Hart—That said by-law be read a second time.

Carried.  
Toohy-Clark—That said by-law be read a third time, signed, sealed and entitled a by-law as in the original motion.

Carried.  
Buckner-Patton—That a further sum of \$9,000 be taken up on the credit obtained by the County from the Canadian Bank of Commerce at Cayuga, and that the Warden and Treasurer sign a note for the same.

Carried.  
Bain-Clark—That a by-law be introduced and read a first time for the purpose of setting apart the sum of \$2,000 for the construction of County Roads for the year 1916.

Carried.  
Toohy-Start—That said by-law be read a second time.

Carried.  
Smelser-Simonton—That said by-law be read a third time, signed, sealed and delivered as in the original motion.

Carried.  
Inglis-Roulston—That this Council do now adjourn to meet again at the call of the Reeve.
