Wool Prices To Advance

The co-operative plan for the marketing of the Ontario Wool Crop is being enthusiastically received in many districts in the County. District Representative Woltz has the names of approximately 300 sheep breeders that will have wool for sale this Spring, totalling about 30,000 pounds or three car loads.

While the plan is new to Ontario stockmen, other provinces in the Dominion have been so disposing of their wool crop for several years. The western provinces have recently rented a warehouse in Toronto to which their wool will be shipped for grading that it may be put on the Ontario market. Ontario, with every facility at its door was the last province in Canada to awaken to the fact that too much of the crop was being lost in the methods of handling and sale.

The Winter Fair Buildings at Guelph will be the grading centre of the Ontario wool this year. Under the co-operative plan, shipments will be made from the various centres in the County on an appas, the wool to be delivered in 250 bur lap sacks supplied by the District Representative free of charge.

One of the most startling features of the plan is that farmers are especially requested not to wash their sheep before shearing as the crop is wanted in its natural greased condition.

Interested parties will kindly communicate with the Ontario Department of Agriculture, Cayuga.
