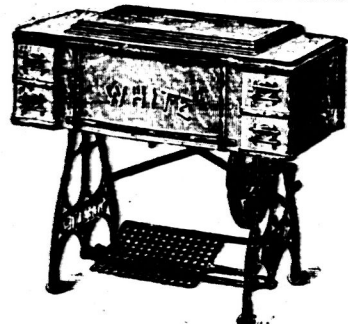

### Blaze at Simcoe Factory

The Dominion Canners suffered financial loss not exceeding \$500,000 on Wednesday last by a fire in the east block of the can making Department. The building is of solid brick walls and interior mill construction, three stories with basement, and 65x290 feet. The basement and two lower stories were used for storage of raw materials and manufactured goods, the floor for making cans, and a line of new machinery for the manufacture of manufacture of sanitary cans had recently got got under way. The fire originated on this floor at 3 o'clock in the afternoon by the explosion of a can of benzo by the time keeper, Arthur Anderson. Of the 102 employees in this building, 84 were on this floor and all escaped. Anderson, at one time enveloped in flames, got off with a severe scorching. The fire brigade responded promptly, and assisted by the employees, brought line after line of hose to play. The more fire-hardies crossed the gangway from the west building and fought their way into the burning storey. They were followed quickly by others and with such success that only a small portion of the roof about the ventilators fell. The stock in the two lower stories was considerably damaged by water, and the tin plate, tons upon tons, in the basement is destroyed. It is impossible to estimate the loss at present. The walls are intact, and it is expected that the work of rebuilding the storey will go on night and day.—Maple Leaf.
