County Council

(Continued from Last Week)
Hyle-Roulston—That the report of the Special Committee on Communications be received and read. Carried.

Cayuga, August 9, 1917.
To the Warden and Members of the County Council:

Gentlemen—We, your Special Committee on Communications beg leave to report as follows:

1. Re auto damages of A. Harris and J. Douglas; be referred to the Good Roads committee.

2. Re communication of Railway Commissioners, be filed with the Clerk.

3. Communication from Kelly & Porter re Auctioneers' License, no action be taken.

4. Re communication from Deputy Minister of Education, be filed with the Clerk.

5. Re communication from N. H. Spence re Municipal Association, be referred to committee of the Whole.

6. Communication from N. B. Wickert re opening in fence, be referred to County Road committee.

7. Communication re Gooler's residence, be referred to Building committee.

8. Re communication from House of Refuge physician, be referred to Home committee.

9. Re communication of A. G. Batten, no action be taken.

All of which is respectfully submitted.

Smelcer-Anderson—That the report of committee on Communications be adopted as read. Carried.

Bradford-Smithers—That the report of the Road and Bridge committee be received and read. Carried.

Cayuga, Aug. 9, 1917.
To the Warden and Members of the County Council.

Gentlemen—We, your Road and Bridge committee beg leave to report as follows:

1. Geo. Shepherd re work performed on Meadows embankment for shovelling snow, filling in holes and levelling embankment \$5.00, and would recommend the same to the Finance committee for payment.

2. Re Nelson bridge on the Indian Line west of Hagersville, would recommend that Mr. Clark, Deputy Reeve of Walpole, be appointed to look after said bridge and keep it in repair.

3. Re bridge on Town Line west of Blackheath, and that Mr. A. Simenton be appointed to work in conjunction with the Wentworth Reeve and have same repaired at once.

4. Re Marr bridge on Town Line between Norfolk and Haldimand, would recommend new stringers and covering and west approach repaired and that Mr. Clark be appointed to have the same repaired.

5. Re Selkirk bridge; would recommend a new covering be placed on it.

6. Re approach on south end of Caledonia bridge; would recommend that the same be repaired and that we advertise in the Caledonia Sachem for sealed tenders.

7. Re Cayuga bridge examined, and find some repairs needed on railing and floor; would also recommend that the west end of the embankment of the Cayuga bridge be assumed by the county as far as the side of Oneida street, and that the chairman and Lishman be appointed to have the above repairing done on said bridge.

8. That the Road and Bridge committee recommend that the following bridges be taken over by the county:

1. Bridge known as the Dixon Creek bridge in the township of Dunn.

2. Bridge known as the Tefft bridge in township of Moulton, across the Oswego creek.

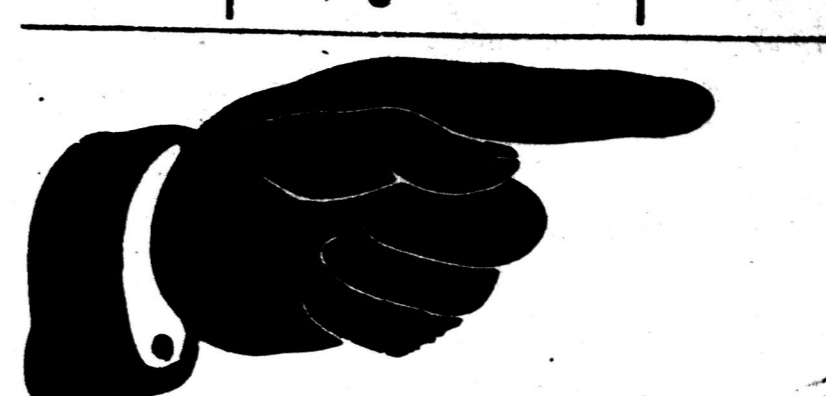
