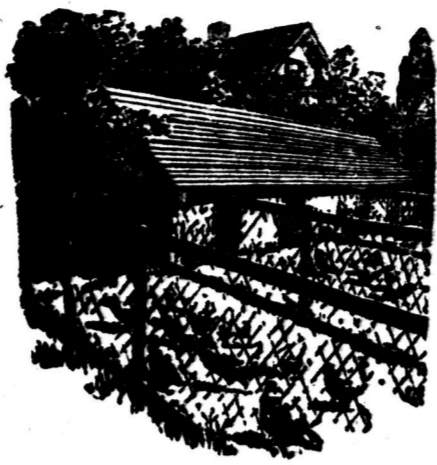

## WESTERN CANADA'S

Farmers Enabled to Pay The Original Cost of

One outstanding fact in connection with the wonderful crops that have been harvested in Western Canada is that the prices obtained for the crops have in hundreds of cases enabled farmers to pay the original cost of their land. Many instances have come to the notice of farmers who bought their lands twelve months ago, and with their first crop were enabled to pay the whole cost of the land and still have sufficient left to carry them through the year until another crop. Land that was bought for from \$10 to \$30 per acre has produced crops worth from \$40 to \$75. The prevailing high price of wheat particularly, and other grains as well, has of course been responsible for this to a great extent.

When it is known that many farmers produced an average of 30 bushels of wheat to the acre it will be easily understood how they made such vast profits this year. These high prices were not confined to any one crop but were reported from all over Alberta and many parts of Saskatchewan. The yield of C. S. Noble of an average of 34 bushels 22 pounds of wheat to the acre for 1,000 acres is undoubtedly a world's record for a tract that large. Mr. Noble a few days ago purchased another 2,000 acres a few miles west of the city of Calgary, and contemplates making it the best stock farm in the West. He never does things by halves and when it is known that he expects to purchase as well some of the best breeding stock obtainable it will be seen that the livestock industry of Alberta will receive a little impetus from Mr. Noble's entry into the business.

Stories are common of farmers who have more than paid the original cost of their land from the proceeds of this year's crop. Many of the automobile firms are unable to get sufficient cars to supply the demand, as practically every farmer is buying at least one of the smaller cars and many of them are purchasing the larger cars. One firm in Calgary sold \$200,000 worth of cars during one month of this year, which was a record. Almost every small town now has its garage where all repairs can be made and new parts bought. This and the general prosperity which it indicates, instigates considerable building activities, and carpenters and builders have been unable to keep up with the amount of

## New German Brutality

If anyone has had any doubt as to the justness of our cause in the present war, or as to the need of supporting it, it has disappeared. On the last day of January Germany issued to the world notice to the effect that all shipping, that does not comply with certain rules that Germany has laid down, will hereafter be sunk without warning. This betrays the true nature of the madness with which the Germans began the war is the first place. The real point at issue is how made as clear as the sun. It is barbarism against civilization, and at least many boats have been sent to the bottom and many lives of non-combatants have been taken.

The call to support this cause has therefore, become more insistent than ever, and every one who wishes to respect himself must face his duty. At Ottawa on the 7th of February when the House of Commons adjourned, the Prime Minister and Sir Wilfrid Laurier both expressed this point. Sir Robert Borden said: "The renewal of the Teuton maritime campaign with all its barbarous methods and the practical enslavement of the Belgians and the Dutch, and the strengthening of Canadian resolution. Canada's work in the war is not concluded." Sir Wilfrid, leader of the opposition expressed the same sentiments and said that in regard to the war, he shared to the full the sentiments expressed by the leader of the Government. The cynically ruthless violation of Belgium, and the atrocities of the Germans has satisfied the world that there should be but one end to the struggle—"such a victory for civilization as will make recurrence of such outrages unknown in the generations to come."

The people of Canada are as a unit in the conviction that a grave responsibility now rests upon us, and the people of Canada are looking to the eligible men to do their duty and to enlist for the defence of the greatest national cause that every one now living will ever be able to support.
