Mr. Percy Inouson, a resident land owner and supporter of S.S. No. 6, waited upon the Council to have his property transferred to S.S. No. 21. The Council after hearing his reasons for the transfer, decided to lay the matter over until all parties concerned are properly notified. Wherefore it was moved by Geo. Morrow, seconded by W. G. Clark, and resolved that the matter in reference to the transfer of Percy Inouson's property from S.S. No. 6, to S.S. No. 21 be laid over until next Council meeting in order that both parties interested, can be properly notified, and that the Clerk do hereby notify the trustees of S.S. No. 6 and 21 of the proposed transfer. Carried.

A deputation of ladies, representing a number of Women's Institutes of the Township of Waipol, consisting of Messdames D. Parkinson, G. L. Miller, W. J. Divine and Mrs. Baggart, waited upon the Council soliciting aid to buy material for Canadian Red Cross. The Council was very much pleased with the reports that ladies gave, of how they had spent at the various grants from the Council during the past year.

Therefore it was moved by W. G. Clark-McBurney—Resolved that Council grant each Women's Institute, on application, \$25 per quarter, to buy material for Red Cross Work. Carried.

Vokes-McBurney—That this Council give the usual grant of \$10 to the Sick Children's Hospital. Carried.

McBurney-Morrow—That Council be authorized to order X copies of the M. A. world for the use of the town and township. Carried.

Morrow-McBurney—That J. O. Shack be appointed assessor of the Township for 1917 at a salary of \$125. Carried.

Vokes-Clark—That J. J. Parsons and W. E. Wicker be appointed directors of the Township. Carried.

Vokes-Morrow—That Ed. Wright be appointed a member of the Local Board of Health for one year according to the Public Health Act. Carried.

Vokes-Morrow—That we do now adjourn to meet Saturday, February 17th at 10 a.m. in Jarvis. Carried.

German Peace Proposals and Our Duty

The offer of Germany to discuss peace has excited world wide attention, and upon our statesmen who have had to answer, grave responsibility has rested. All the nations of the Entente have the same conclusion. We desire peace but it must be a well-grounded peace with proper guarantees. These guarantees do not appear to us to be forthcoming, and so as we entered the war for a great and worthy purpose, we cannot relinquish the war till our worthy purpose is attained, or until we are completely driven off the field. We are not driven off the field, and our leaders tell us that it will not be till next year that we shall attain our full strength. Therefore, although we are a peace-loving people, we must still pursue the task we have undertaken, to defend the rights of the weak and the suffering.

The speech of Mr. Lloyd George, the British Prime Minister, in discussing the German peace proposals, has expressed the view of our Empire and of Empire and our Allies. In that speech the Prime Minister said — "The allies entered this war to defend Europe against the aggression of Prussian military domination, having begun it, they must insist that the only end is the most complete and effective guarantee against the possibility of that caste ever again disturbing the peace of Europe. Prussia, since she got into the hands of that caste, has been a bad neighbor, has been a bad neighbor, arrogant, threatening, bullying, shifting her boundaries at her will, and taking one part of the field after another from her weaker neighbors and adding them to her own dominions."

This view we have all accepted, and we can see no other ground than in honor we can take.

This being the case, the duty is pressed upon us with still greater force to move with the utmost speed to secure the remaining portion of the 500,000 men
