Germans have not ones. He thought the drive was not commented because rain set in on Sept. 5 and continued for over two months. The drive must necessarily be slow owing to the effect of the shelling, the land ahead being completely torn up into great holes from eight to sixty feet deep, roads have to be constructed through before the troops can proceed further. Trench raiding was introduced by the British and has been adopted by all. The description of the British tanks and how they were received by the Germans was interesting and amusing, one anecdote in particular pleasing the audience. The officer in charge of one of these engines of war ran his tank one hundred yards or more into No Man's Land, where a shortage of gasoline left him stranded close to the enemies lines. They had pigeons on board for sending messages, and the Captain sent this message: "We are stuck among the Germans, with no gas. What the — are we to do." Captain Jackson in his closing remarks said Britain had three million fighting men in France, not counting men used for other purposes, and that every soldier on the front feels confident that they have the Germans beaten at their own game, and is waiting eagerly for the word to go ahead. He pleaded for men to enlist so that those now training in Canada could go to France because when peace proposals are considered, the fighting men in France will make a weighty argument in securing terms.
