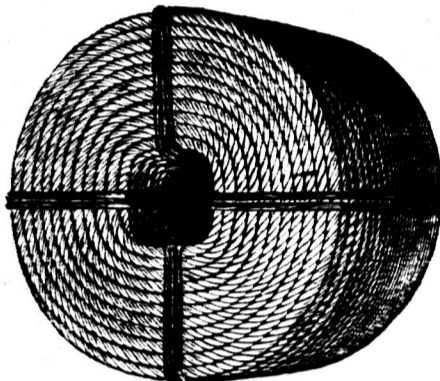

Wednesday evening, June 27, Mr. Chas. E.
