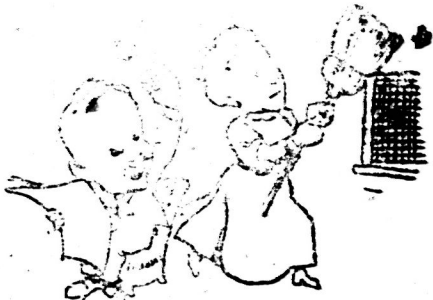

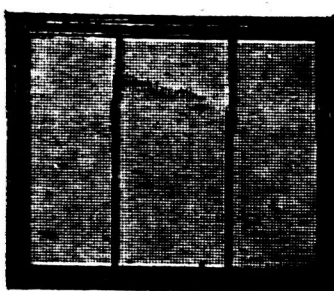

## COUNTY COUNCIL,

Fourth Session

FIRST DAY

Thursday, June 7, 1917.

Council met pursuant to adjournment. The Warden in the chair.

All members present except Mr. Bain. Clark-Wilton—That we resume business with the Warden in the chair. carried.

The minutes of last meeting were then read.

Pyle-Roulston—That minutes of former meeting be adopted as read. carried. The following communications were then read.

1. Deputy Minister of Education re Grant to Public Schools.

2. Jarvis Continuation School, application for grant.

3. Dr. A. F. Pringle, application for increase in salary.

4. Robert F. Parker and others, Notice under Ditches and Watercourse Act.

5. Kelly & Porter, re Auctioneer's Licenses.

6. Grand Trunk Railway Company re Protection at Forks' Road Crossing.

7. County Board of Agriculture, application for payment of grant.

8. Speaker's Patriotic League, asking for payment of expenses.

Roulston-Sawle—That Messrs. Clark, Smith and Pyle be a committee on communications. carried.

Smelser-Simonton—That we do now adjourn to allow the different committees to meet. carried.

Smelser-Simonton—That we resume business with the Warden in the Chair. carried.

Pyle-Sawle—That the by-law confirming by-law no. 3, of the township of Sherbrook be read a second and third time and passed and that same be signed and sealed.

Bradford-Smith—That by-law confirming by-law no. 4 of the township of Sherbrook be read a second and third time and passed, and that the same be signed and sealed.

Smith-Smithers—That the Warden be appointed to see after the property belonging to the county and get them out of the customs and take care of the same. carried.

Stewart-Pyle—That the equalized assessment for the county for the year 1917 be the same as applied in 1916. carried.

Anderson-Smelser—That a by-law be introduced for the purpose of equalizing the assessment of the county for the year 1917, and the bills be read the first time. carried.

Roulston-Pyle—That the by-law to equalize the assessment of the county be read a second and third time and passed, signed and sealed and entitled a by-law as in the original motion.

Smelser-Simonton—That the report of the special committee on communications be received and read. carried.
