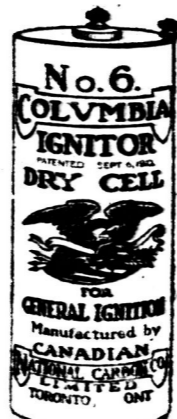

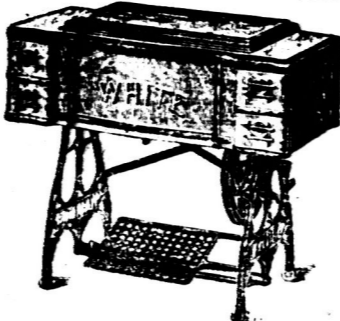

Hart-Cain—That the report of the special committee on traders and trades be adopted as read, carried.

Anderson-Stewart—That the report of the good roads committee be received and read, carried.

Cayuga, March 7, 1917.

To the Warden and Members of the County Council:

Gentlemen—We, your county road committee, beg leave to report as follows:

1. That we have examined the accounts for maintenance and construction presented by the superintendent and recommend them for payment.
2. Would recommend that the amount of expenditure in maintenance on the county highways for the year 1917 be \$11,000, as per estimates of the superintendent attached herewith.
3. Would recommend that the amount of expenditure to be charged to construction on the county highways be \$5,000 for installing 1 1/2 miles from the Village of Caledonia north on Division 23, Road 2.
4. That we accept the quotation of A. & W. J. Bailey for No. 1 Oak plank at \$42 per M feet at their mill in Hagersville and that the superintendent be authorized to order from the above mill 7000 feet to be cut 14 feet long and 3 inches thick for bridges in estimates annexed thereto.
5. That the clerk be authorized to prepare a by-law making provision for the expenditure on the county highways for the year 1917.
6. That the superintendent have the gasoline tractor put in good running order and advertise it for sale along with any other machinery the county may have that is not required in connection with county work, and the county work, and the county roads committee have authority to make the sale and fix the price.
7. That the superintendent to make the sale and fix the price.
8. That the superintendent be authorized to pay the same schedule of wages this coming season as was paid in 1916.

Nays: Smelser, Stewart, Wilton, Clark, Smith-Toohy in amendment—That the report of the good roads committee so far as maintenance, but in part of construction whereby we move the following amendment: That this County Council build in the Township of Seneca, on the Hamilton and Port Dover Plank Road adjoining Caledonia, one and one-half miles, in the Township of North Cayuga, on Talbot Road leading to Cayuga village, one mile in the Township of Oneida on the Hamilton and Port Dover Road adjoining the village of Hagersville, one mile. In the Township of Walpole, on the Talbot Road, one and three quarter miles to be built this year, 1917, with this provision, in event of war becoming worse and more cloudy, to cut it out for this year, and if brighter to go on and build same. Lost.
