Military Service Act

Important Announcement to All EXEMPTED MEN and to the Public Generally

IN dealing with the very large number of claims for exemption brought forward for consideration in connection with Class I under the Military Service Act, it has occurred, as was inevitable, that as a result of false statements and difficulties put in the way of investigation, some individuals have secured exemption whose proper place is in the Army.

It is not the intention of the Government to allow these men to evade permanently their obligation to bear their part in the military defence of the Country and of the ideals for which we are fighting. To do so would defeat the purpose of the Act, and cause grave injustice to men in the second class necessarily called out to fill their places.

Exemptions Granted on False Grounds

It is, therefore, proposed to scrutinize carefully all exemptions granted to date in order to separate those which have been granted on false or insufficient grounds from those that are well founded.

With this object in view the various Registrars under the Military Service Act have been instructed to issue a series of questionnaires to exempted men. These questionnaires must be filled up correctly and returned promptly under penalty of forfeiture of exemption for failure to do so.

Exempted Men Who Have Changed Address

It is therefore important in their own interest that all exempted men who have changed their address since their exemption was granted and who have not already notified the Registrar of such change should notify him at once. Under the Regulations it is the duty of exempted men to keep the Registrar advised of any change of address, and failure to receive the questionnaire by reason of neglect of this duty must be treated as equivalent to failure to return the questionnaire after receipt.

Citizens Urged to Assist

In many instances information has been furnished by members of the public which has led to the cancellation of exemptions obtained by false or misleading statements. Further co-operation of this character is invited. The Government regard it as the duty of all loyal citizens, not only to the Country, but to the men at the front, to assist in this way in securing reinforcements on a just and legal basis. Correspondence of this character will be treated as strictly confidential and will receive the fullest investigation.

the streets of the said Village to lay such mains at within any distance no less than six feet of the gas mains of this Company, and where necessary to do so cross the mains of this Company at a distance not less than six inches therefrom, and that upon any claim being made by this Company for the prevention of such other Company or Companies laying their mains within six feet of the mains of this Company this By-law may be pleaded as an estoppel by such other Company or Companies against this Company.

(a) Mains, pipes or conduits for carrying or conveying natural gas underground in any street or streets of the said Village shall not be laid down therein by the Corporation or such other Company or Companies now holding or hereafter obtaining from the Corporation the privilege of laying gas mains under the streets of the said Village within a distance of less than six feet of the mains, pipes or conduits for carrying or conveying natural gas underground of the Company without the consent of the Company or the authority of the Ontario Railway and Municipal Board.

7. So long as the Company has a sufficient supply of natural gas for its consumers in Jarvis and its consumers in other municipalities than the Village of Jarvis, in which it is now or may hereafter be operating, supplied or entitled to be supplied by the Company under its obligation to such other Municipalities, the Company shall supply all buildings within the Corporation situate upon land lying along the line of any supply pipe within the said Village upon the request in writing of the owner, occupant or other person in charge of any such buildings who agrees to take gas subject to the Company's regulations.

(a) Provided, however, that the Company, in case of a deficiency of gas, shall not be entitled to discriminate against the consumers for the time being in said Village of Jarvis in favor of its consumers for the time being in other Municipalities.

8. The Company will at its own expense make connections between its pipe lines and the service pipes of persons residing in such Municipality of Jarvis along streets traversed by such pipe lines.

(a) Provided that all persons requiring natural gas shall bear the expense of laying and maintaining their own service pipes from the street line to and upon the premises of such persons.

9. Meters shall be supplied by the Company to the Consumers and shall be furnished at a rental not exceeding Ten cents per month.

(a) The Company in order to increase the capacity of the distribution equipment, shall also install and maintain three four-inch low pressure regulators in lieu and instead of the three two-inch low pressure regulators now and heretofore in use in the low pressure distribution system of mains in said Village. And shall also lay and maintain for a distance of not less than one hundred feet from each of the said low pressure regulators a pipe line of not less than six inches in diameter and in each case the said pipe line is to connect the low pressure regulator with the low pressure main of the distribution system of the said Village.

(b) The Company shall also install and maintain one two-inch low pressure regulator upon its Low Pressure Distribution System of main in that part of the said Village lying Westerly of the Grand Trunk Railway lines from Hamilton to Port Dover.

10. Upon the expiration or other determination of the franchise hereby granted the Company shall if requested by the Municipality and shall remove its property from the streets of the said Municipality and shall restore such streets to as good condition as the same were in before such removal, without cost to the Corporation and in default thereof the Corporation may remove the same or any part thereof and may charge the cost of such removal and the restoration of the streets to the said Company, and the same shall be payable by the Company to the Corporation forthwith hereafter.

11. The Company agrees to maintain a sufficient "cut-off" at its own expense on each service pipe at some suitable point between the main and the building to which gas is being supplied.

12. Natural Gas furnished by the Company for light, heat and power purposes under the powers granted by this By-law shall be furnished and distributed in Jarvis at prices and rates not to exceed the following, that is to say:

(a) For ordinary business and domestic purposes the sum of Thirty-five (35) cents per 1,000 cubic feet.

(b) For manufacturing and Public School purposes where the amount used for such purpose by the consumers does not exceed 100,000 cubic feet per month the sum of Thirty-five (35) cents per 1,000 cubic feet.

(c) For manufacturing and Public School purposes where the amount used for such purpose by the consumers exceeds 100,000 cubic feet per month the sum of Thirty (30) cents per 1,000 cubic feet.

(d) The rates and prices hereinbefore provided for in sub-sections (a), (b) and (c) of this paragraph, No. 12, shall come into force and take effect from and after the 15th day of June, A. D. 1918, and in the meantime the Company shall continue to furnish gas for the purposes defined in said sub-sections (a), (b) and (c) to its Consumers at the same price and rates as the Company is now furnishing the same.

13. Subject to the provisions of sub-section (a), paragraph No. 6 hereof it is expressly declared that the franchise hereby granted is not to be deemed an exclusive franchise but on the contrary the Corporation may grant to any other person, Company or Companies franchises for purposes similar or partly similar to the purposes for which this franchise is granted and the privileges granted or conferred by this By-law or intended, so to be shall be accepted and executed by the Company subject to all rights, franchises and privileges in favor of persons, firms and corporations other than the Company now in force through, under or along said streets and highways.

14. The Company shall from time to time and at all times during the period in which the rights and privileges in aid by the said By-law granted are continued save harmless and keep indemnified the said Corporation from all loss, costs, charges, damages and expenses whatsoever which may be occasioned to the property of the Corporation or to any person or private Corporation within the limits of the said Village of Jarvis or to any person using the said streets by reason of the defective condition or construction of any of the mains, pipes and conduits or other works of the Company within the limits of the said Corporation or from any negligence of the Company its servants or agents in opening the said streets or in laying and maintaining said mains, pipes and conduits within the limits of the said Village or in doing any other work incidental to the laying or maintaining of mains, pipes and conduits or other works or in consequence of the failure of the Company its servants or agents to restore the said streets to as good condition as they were before being opened by the Company or for any other act, neglect or default of the Company its servants or agents whatsoever which the Municipal Corporation would be primarily liable to any person or private Corporation.

15. The Company shall repay to the Corporation all sums paid by it to the Engineer Road Commissioner or other officers of the Corporation for services performed by him or them in connection with the Company's work or other necessary work of inspection and supervision under this By-law and shall also repay to the Corporation the costs, charges and expense of the Solicitor of the Corporation of and incidental to the drawing and passing of this By-law and of obtaining the assent of the rate-payers thereto and of the agreement hereinafter provided for.

16. If the Company shall commit a breach of or omit to comply with any of the provisions of this By-law or of the said agreement the Corporation may give notice in writing specifying the breach complained of and the intent of the Corporation to forfeit and determine the franchise and privileges hereby granted unless the Company shall within one month after the service upon it of the said notice remedy the said breach and in case the Company shall within the said period of one month fail to remedy the said breach, the said franchise and the privileges hereby granted shall at the option of the Corporation after the expiration of the period mentioned in such notice wholly cease and determine without the Corporation being liable to the Company for any compensation or damage for such forfeiture, and the Corporation may thereupon formally repeal the said By-law and cancel the said agreement.

17. THAT this By-law shall take effect after having received the assent of the electors and after the Company shall have entered into an agreement
