branch thereof across or along any street or lay granolithic, macadam, pave, boulevard or improve any street or do any public work whatsoever on any street where any of the Company's mains, conduits or pipes are laid the and maintain one two-inch low pres-Company shall forthwith at its own sure regulator upon its Low Pressure expense elevate, lower, change or remove such mains, conduits or pipes or any of them as requested by the said of the Grand Trunk Railway lines Council so that such sewer, drain, ditch or branch thereof may be laid, built, lowered, altered or constructed or that such street may be macadam ized, paved, laid with granolithic or otherwise improved or such public work or works may be done at the point or place determined upon by the

(f) In the event of any leakage of gas occuring in any street through any defect in said pipes or the laying thereof the Company shall forthwith after notice repair such defect. (g) All mains, pipes and conduits

shal be laid not less than six inches below the surface of the said stree unless otherwise directed by the permission of the Municipal Council of

the said Village.

5. Before laying any mains, pipes or conduits in the Village of Jarvis the Company shall from time to time furnish the said Corporation with a plan showing the streets to be opened and the proposed location of the mains, pipes and conduits (other than service pipes) thereon giving full par ticulars as to the size of such mains pipes and conduits to be used and in laying the same shall conform to al reasonable regulations that the Council of the said Corporation shall make with respect thereto, and from time to time as the same shall be laid and within sixty days after such laying shall file in the office of the Clerk o the said Corporation full and complete maps showing the sizes, locations and positions of the said mains, pipes and conduits and the Company shall no at any time break up, dig or trench any street to a greater extent than 200 feet ahead of pipe laying.

6. The said Company will at al times permit any other Company of Companies now holding or hereafter obtaining from the Corporation the privilege of laying gas mains unde the streets of the said Village to lay such mains to within any distance no less than six feet of the gas mains of this Company, and where necessary to do so cross the mains of this Company at a distance not less than six inches therefrom, and that upon any ciaim being made by this Company for the prevention of such other Com pany or Companies laying their mains within six feet of the mains of this Company this By-law may be pleaded as an estoppel by such other Company or Companies against this Company.

(a) Mains, pipes or conduits for carrying or conveying natural gas un lerground in any street or streets of the said Village shall not be laid down therein by the Corporation or such other Company or Companies now holding or hereafter obtaining from the Corporation the privilege of laying gas mains under the streets of the said Village within a distance of less than Six feet of the mains, pipes or conduits for carrying or conveying natural gas under-ground of the Com pany without the consent of the Company or the authority of the "Ontaric Railway and Municipal Board."

7. So long as the Company has a sufficient, suply of natural gas for its consumers in Jarvis and its consum ers in other municipalities than the Village of Jarvis, in which it is nov r may hereafter be operating, sup olied or entitled to be supplied by the company under its obligation to such ther Municipalities, the Company hall supply all buildings within the orporation situate upon land lying siong the line of any supply pipe ithin the said Village upon the re quest in writing of the owner, occupant or other person in charge of any such buildings who agrees to take gas

subject to the Company's regulations. (a) Provided, however, that the company, in case of a deficiency of gas, shall not be entitled to discriminate against the consumers for the ime being in said Village of Jarvis n favor of its consumers for the time ing in other Municipalities.

8. The Company will at its own expense make connections between its pipe lines and the service pipes of persons residing in such Municipality of Jarvis along streets traversed by such pipe lines.

(a) Provided that all persons requiring natural gas shall bear the expense of laying and maintaining their own service pipes from the street line o and upon the premises of such

9. Meters shall be supplied by the Company to the Consumers and shall be furnished at a rental not exceeding en cents per month.

(a) The Company in order to inrease the capacity of the distribution quipment, shall also install and mainain three four-inch low pressure regulators in lieu and instead of the hree two-inch low pressure regulators now and heretofore in use in the low pressure distribution system of mains in said Village. And shall also lay and maintain for a distance of not for.



less than one hundred feet from each of the said low pressure regulators a pipe line of not less than six inches in diameter and in each case the said pipe lines is to connect the low pressure regulator with the low pressure main of the distribution system of

the said Village.

(b) The Company shall also install rom Hamilton to Port Dover.

10. Upon the expiration or other deermination of the franchise hereby granted the Company shall if requested by the Corporation so to do emove its property from the streets of the said Municipality and shall restore such streets to as good condition as the same were in before such renoval, without cost to the Corporation and in default thereof the Corporation nay remove the same or any part hereof and may charge the cost of such removal and the restoration o he streets to the said Company, and he same shall be payable by the Com pany to the Corporation forthwith

11. The Company agrees to mainain a sufficient "cut-off" at its own expense on each service pipe at some mirable point between the main and he building to which gas is being supplied.

12. Natural Gas furnished by the omeany for light, heat and power urposes under the powers granted by his By-law shall be furnished and disributed in Jarvis at prices and rates tot to exceed the following, that is

(a) For ordinary business and do nestic purposes the sum of Thirty-five 35) cents per 1,000 cubic feet.

(b) For manufacturing and Public ichool purposes where the amoun ised for such purpose by the consumers does not exceed 100,000 cubic eet per month the sum of Thirty-five 35) cents per 1,000 cubic feet.

(c) For manufacturing and Public chool purposes where the amount need for such purpose by the consumers exceeds 100,000 cubic feet per nonth the sum of Thirty (30) cents er 1,000 cubic feet. (d) The rates and prices hereinbe-

ore provided for in sub-sections (a), b) and (c) of this paragraph, No. 12, shall come into force and take effect rom and after the 15th day of June, 1. D., 1918, and in the meantime the company shall continue to furnish gas or the purposes defined in said subections (a), (b) and (c) to its Conumers at the same price and rates is the Company is now furnishing the

13. Subject to the provisions of subection (a), paragraph No. 6 hereof, is expressly declared that the franhise hereby granted is not to be eemed an exclusive franchise but on he contrary the Corporation may grant to any other person, Company r Companies franchises for purposes similar or partly similar to the purposes for which this franchise is granted and the privileges granted

conferred by this By-law or intended to be shall be accepted and exeuted by the Company subject to all ights, franchises and privileges in avor of persons, firms and corporaions other than the Company now n force through, under or along said streets and highways.

14. The Company shall from time o time and at all times during the seriod in which the rights and privieges in and by the said By-law ranted are continued save harmless nd keep indemnified the said Cor oration from all loss, costs, charges, amages and expenses whatsoever hich may be occasioned to the proprty of the Corporation or to any erson or private Corporation within he limits of the said Village of Jaris or to any person using the said treets by reason of the defective conlition or construction of any of the nains, pipes and conduits or other vorks of the Company within the limis of the said Corporation or from any negligence of the Company its ervants or agents in opening the said streets or in laying and maintaining said mains, pipes and conduits within he limits of the said Village or in doing any other work incidental to the aying or maintaining of mains, pipes and conduits or other works or in consequence of the failure of the Company its servants or agents to restore the said streets to as good condition as they were before being opened by he Company or for any other act, neglect or default of the Company its servants or agents whatsoever for which the Municipal Corporati would be primarily liable to any per son or private Corporation.

15. The Company shall repay to the orporation all sums paid by it to the Engineer Road Commissioner or other officers of the Corporation for services performed by him or them in connecion with the Company's work or the necessary work of inspection and supervision under this By-law and shall also repay to the Corporation the costs, charges and expense of the Soicitor of the Corporation of and incidental to the drawing and passing of this By-law and of obtaining the assent of the rate-payers thereto and of the agreement hereinafter provided

16. If the Company shall commit a breach of or omit to comply with any of the provisions of this By-law or of the said agreement the Corporation may give notice in writing specifying the breach complained of and the inent of the Corporation to forfeit and determine the franchise and privileges nereby granted unless the Company shall within one month after the ser vice upon it of the said notice remedy he said breach and in case the Company shall within the said period of one month fail to remedy the said breach, the said franchise and the privileges hereby granted shall at the ption of the Corporation after the expiration of the period mentioned in such notice wholly cease and determine without the Corporation being liable to the Company for any compensation or damage for such forfeiture, and the Corporation may thereupon formally repeal the said By-law and cancel the said agreement.

17. THAT this By-law shall take effect after having received the assent of the electors and after the Company shall have entered into an agreement
