"I am fairly sure that an order-in-council has been passed by the Government practically retaining charge of the harbor of Port Dover, and if it has not already been passed I am pretty sure that it will be, and that everything that is necessary will be done for the adequate development of the harbor under the auspices of the public works department. We are going to see the people of Ontario in a position to receive from the harbor of Port Dover whatever benefits there are to be received, and," said he, "if the Grand Trunk won't develop the harbor as it should be developed, and someone else will develop it, I see no reason why someone should not have the necessary power to carry out the work."

The statement appeared to please the delegation, which represented the municipal councils and boards of trade of Port Dover, Simcoe, Waterford, Brantford, Paris, Hespeler, Kitchener, Waterloo and Elmira and was headed by Hon. W. Charlton, M.P. for Norfolk; Senator McCall, P. S. Scott of South Waterloo, W. F. Cockshutt of Brantford, W. D. Euler, M.P., and William Weichel, ex-M.P., respectively, for North Waterloo. Members of the deputation emphasized the need of complete development of the harbor.

Mr. Charlton declared that the Grand Trunk had been a dog in the manger and had held up progress in that portion of the province. He ventured the opinion that an expenditure of about \$75,000 in repairs, etc., would suffice until after the war. The Lake Erie and Northern Railway would establish a ferry service which would take care of freight which came into the district.

The minister declared himself as being much impressed by the speeches. Nothing, he said, meant so much to the people of Canada as transportation.

As to the attitude of the Grand Trunk Railway, I am satisfied that everything you say is correct. The minister then announced that the Government would take over the harbor and develop it, and that an amount had already been inserted in the supplementary estimates to repair the damage that had been caused by storms.

"As to the harbor scheme, I only wish I were in a position to say 'yes' to you today," said Mr. Carvell, "and I would, were we living under ordinary conditions. But, you know, expenditures on new work must be restricted on account of the war. This year we are raising \$8,000,000 of the ordinary revenue of Canada is \$20,000,000."

"My first action was to cancel the water contract for the city of St. John which I reside. I would like to see what the rate on the N. Railway a ferry company (L. F. and willing to do regarding the harbor unless we were. I will, then, consider from Ontario, and long for you if we can raise the money up the lakes in Hamilton, and will mainly visit Port Dover."

BY-LAW NO.

(CONCLUDED FROM PAGE 5)

In writing under seal with the Municipal Corporation of the Village of Jarvis, upon the terms and to the effect and containing the conditions and provisions set forth in the agreement contained in Schedule "A" hereto, and that the said agreement between the Corporation and the said Company be and the same is hereby ratified and approved, and the Reeve and the Clerk of the Corporation are hereby authorized and required to execute the same on behalf of the Corporation upon the same being executed by the Company within thirty days after the final passing hereof.

18. The privileges granted to the company by this By-law are upon and subject to the condition that this By-law shall not come into effect until the Company shall have entered into an agreement in writing under seal with the Corporation upon the terms and to the effect and containing the conditions and provisions set forth in the said form of Agreement Schedule "A" hereunto annexed.

19. That in case the Company shall refuse or neglect to observe any conditions, restrictions or provisions herein contained or neglects to perform or omit to perform the obligations herein imposed or to do or complete any of the work required to be done by it in accordance with the terms of this By-law within a reasonable time after notice requiring it to do so, then the said Corporation may if it deem expedient, cause and have the said work or any of the said things to be done performed or completed and the expense thereof shall be a charge against and be paid by the said Company to the said Corporation.

20. That all obligations, on the part of the Company, heretofore entered into or provided for or contained in any agreement or By-law relating to the supply and sale of natural gas within the Village of Jarvis heretofore in force and effect shall upon the coming into effect of this By-law, cease and be determined and such obligations, agreements and By-laws stand cancelled and cease to be binding upon the Company; and the rights, privileges and obligations of the Company as to the sale, supply and distribution of natural gas by the Company within the Village from and after the coming into effect of this By-law shall in any dispute, disagreement or difference arising with reference thereto be solely determined by the terms, conditions and provisions of this By-law.

21. The conditions and obligations of this By-law shall extend to and bind the Company, its successors and assigns and the Company observing and performing the conditions and obligations to be observed and performed in its part; the Corporation shall not alter or amend this By-law or revoke any of the provisions hereof without the consent in writing of the Company.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT made and entered into (in duplicate) this day of April, 1918.

BETWEEN THE DOMINION NATURAL GAS COMPANY, LIMITED, a body Corporate or politic organized under the laws of the Province of Ontario, hereinafter called the Company, of the First Part;

AND THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE VILLAGE OF JARVIS, hereinafter called the Corporation, of the Second Part.

WHEREAS, the Council of the said Corporation on the day of April, 1918, passed a By-law, Number 1, granting to the Company certain rights and privileges to construct, maintain, complete and operate works within the Village of Jarvis for the production, sale and distribution of natural gas for the purpose of light, heat and power within and through the limits of the said Village of Jarvis by means of mains, pipes and conduits for the period of Twenty-five years from the date of the passing of said By-law subject to the terms, conditions and stipulations, regulations, provisions and things therein contained, a copy of which said By-law is hereto annexed.

AND WHEREAS these presents are intended to give effect to said By-law NOW THESE PRESENTS WITNESS that in consideration of the premises and of the granting of the rights, privileges and franchises which are by the said By-law granted by the Corporation to the Company, the Company for itself, its successors and assigns hereby covenants, promises and agrees to and with the Corporation and the Corporation covenants, promises and agrees to and with the Company as follows, that is to say:
