"I am fairly sure that an order-in ouncil has been passed by the Government practically retaking charge of the harbor of Port Dover, and if it has not airendy been passed t am pretty sore that it will be, and that everything that is necessary will be done for the adequate development of the harbor under the suspices of the public works department. We are going to see the people of Ourari. are in a position to receive from the harbor of Port Dover whatever benefits there re to be received, and," said he, "if the Grand Trank won't develop the harbor as t should be developed, and someone else will develop it, I see no reason why someone should not have the necessary power to carry out the work."

The statement appeared to please the delegation, which represented the municipal councils and boards of trade of Port Dover, Simose, Waterford, Brantsord, Paris, Hespeler, Kitchner, Waterloo and Elmira and was headed by ilon, W. Chariton, M.P. for Norfolk; Senator Me-Call. F. S. Scott of South Waterloo, W. F. Cockshutt of Brantford, W. D. Enler, respectfully, for North Waterloo, Memhere of the deputation emphasized the need of complete development of the har-

Mr. Chariton declared that the Grand Trunk had been a dog in the manger and had held up progress in that portion of the province. He ventured the opinion that anjexpenditure of about \$75,000 in ropairs, etc., would suffice until after the war. The Lake Eric and Northern Railway would establish a ferry service which would take care of freight which came into the district.
