Genulemen - We, your Special Committee, to define the duties of the Supply, Building and fiome Committees, beg leave to report as follows:

1. In addition to the duties pre scribed by law the duties of the Sup ply Committee shall be as follows:

(a). To purchase supplies for the goal and in conjunction with the Home Committee in all matters relating to the House of Refuge to parchase supplies for the same after having reported to the Council and report approved of.

2. In addition to the duties prescribed by law the duties of the Building Committee shall be as follows: To manage and report on all matters connected with the county buildings, except the House of Refuge, and to manage the erection of any new buildings or any new addi tions to the present buildings at the House of Refuge Farm after having reported to the Council and the report being approved of.
