### SEVENTH SESSION

[Concluded from Last Week]  
Doyle-Wilton—That the report of the Road and Bridge committee be received and read. carried.

ROAD AND BRIDGE COMMITTEE  
Cayuga, Aug. 8, 1918.

To the Warden and Members of the County Council:

Gentlemen—Your Road and Bridge Committee would report as follows:—

Re Selkirk Bridge  
The old plank were sold for \$38.40. Cost of guard rail \$4.75. Balance of \$32.22 was returned by Mr. Buckley.

Re Caledonia Bridge  
Would recommend that Mr. Sawle be instructed to keep the floor of the bridge in repair.

Re Middough Bridge  
Has been filled at the ends by H. Middough—\$2.50 which we would recommend to the Finance Committee for payment.

GOOD ROADS COMMITTEE  
Cayuga, Aug. 8, 1918.

To the Warden and Members of the County Council:

Gentlemen—Your Good Roads Committee beg leave to report as follows:—

1. We have examined the construction and maintenance accounts presented by the Superintendent and recommend them for payment.

2. That we renew the two policies carried with the Employees Liability Assurance Corporation, Ltd., covering employees and public from July 19, 1918, to July 19, 1919.

3. That the Walpole Council be asked to pass a by-law giving the Michigan Central Railway Co. permission to sell the County of Haldimand stone screenings to be used on their county road system and exempting the said company from a business tax for so doing, and the Superintendent attend the Walpole Council meeting on Aug. 17, 1918, and bring the matter before them.

4. That the Superintendent have notices placed along the MacAdam sections of the County Highway, at a suitable distance apart, that speed limit is 20 miles per hour.

5. That the Warden and Chairman of this committee be appointed to consult with the Superintendent in connection with repairs to bridges and culverts, or any new culverts which are necessary to build, with power to act.

6. That the Warden, Chairman and Mr. Doyle, Mr. Stewart and the Superintendent be a committee to examine bridge on Division 14, opposite the farm of Hiram Gee, and be given power to make any alterations which they may consider necessary.

and placed \$5000 on the House of Refuge with Fidelity Phoenix Insurance Co., Mr. Bilger, Agt. Premium \$75.00, which we recommend to Finance Committee for payment.

Policy No. 1015—With J. J. Cleary \$3,000 on House of Refuge and \$1500 on Jailor's residence—total, \$4500. Premium \$60. Recommended to Finance committee for payment.

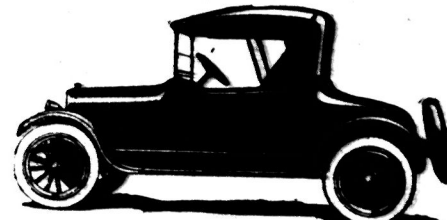

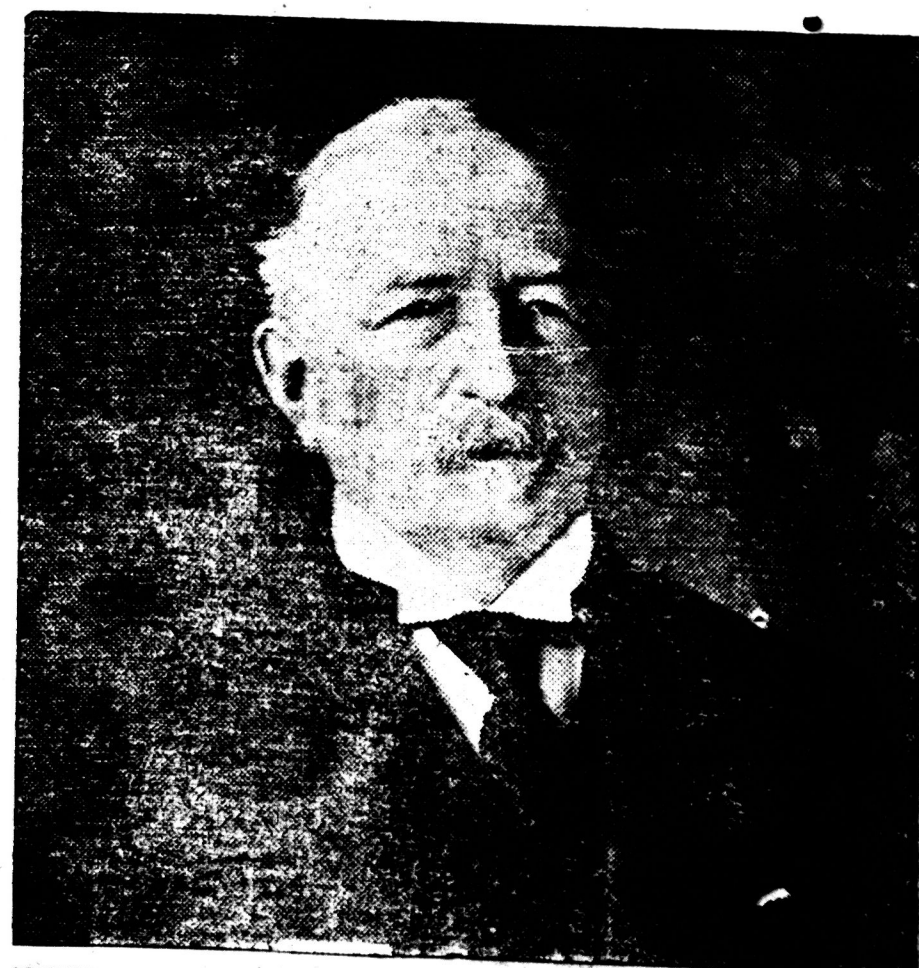
