### FIRST SESSION—FIRST DAY

Tuesday, January 22, 1918.

Council met pursuant to the statute at 2 p. m., the Clerk presiding.

4. National Sanitarium Association, applying for grant.
5. Clerks of Northumberland and Durham Counties, re petitioning legislation to increase dog tax.
6. County of Kent, re revision of voters' list.
7. Hospital for Sick Children, applying for grant.
8. Trustees' Association, re annual meeting.
9. Haldimand Law Association, applying for grant.
10. County of Prince Edward, re amendment to legislation on liability for accidents on county roads under construction.

Smelser-Lishman—That Messrs. Wilton, Sawle and Smithers be a special committee on Communications. carried.

Smelser-Buckley—That Messrs. Holland, Doyle, Smelser, Lishman, Smith, MacQuillen and Hudspeth be a committee to strike the Standing committee for the year 1918. carried.

Wilton-Stewart—That Cornelius Sage be appointed a High School Trustee for the village of Hagersville for the years 1918-19-20. carried.

Pyle-Bradford—That E. J. Ramsey be appointed to the Board of Education for the High School Trustee for the town of Dunnville for the years 1918-19-20. carried.

Smith-Smithers—That the by-law regarding the cleaning of seed be amended as follows: That tight boxes may be used for the removal of refuse from said cleaners in place of sacks, and that fee bill be read a first time. carried.

Stewart-Wilton—That this Council do now adjourn to allow the striking committee to meet, and also the committee on Communications. carried.

Bradford-Lyon—That we resume business with the Warden in the Chair. carried.

Smith-Hudspeth—That the report on communications be received and read. carried.

Cayuga, Jan. 22 1918.  
To the Warden and Members of the County Council.

Gentlemen—We, your duly appointed committee on Communications, beg leave to report as follows:

1. Re communication of Good Roads Form to be filled in by Superintendent; we recommend that the Superintendent fill in the same and forward it to the government.
2. That the amount granted to the Y. M. C. A. be paid and by-law passed there for.
3. Re closing the Road Allowance in townships of Moulton, Sherbrooke (and Dunn); we recommend no action be taken.
4. Re National Sanitarium Association we refer this application to the Council as a whole.
5. Re communication from counties of Northumberland and Durham; we recommend the Warden and Clerk sign a petition asking for legislation to fix dog tax at \$2 for single dog and \$5 each additional one or bitch.
6. Re petition of county council of Kent; we recommend no action.
7. Re grant to Sick Children's Hospital; we refer this matter to the Council as a whole, and recommend a grant.
8. Re Annual Convention of Ontario Good Roads Association, we recommend no action be taken.
9. Re grant to Haldimand Law Library, we recommend a grant of \$75.
10. Re communication from County of Prince Edward, re claims for accidents on county roads under construction or repair; we recommend the Warden and Clerk sign and forward a petition to the like effect.
