These strange specimens of wood sculpture are still to be found in British Columbia, especially along the Pacific Coust, as well'as in Alassa. in many a waterside village these curiously crested potes stand in prominent places, or along the main street, as in Alert Hay, or over the graves of brouze warriors who have gone to their happy hunting grounds. To the white man they are as mysterious as the druidical stones, but to the Indian they tell the clan to which the dead Indian belonged, as well as his tribal

Each clan of the Indians of Alaska and British Columbia has its own totem, from which it takes its name. Thus there is the clan of the wolf, the clan of the raven, the clan of the frog and so on. All the members of the clan are supposed to be descended, actually and Integuily, from the animals whose names they bear, and to conduct themselves always wiell due remembrance
