Petition Filed Against Election of Norfolk Member

Toronto, Jan. 26—A petition has now been filed against the election of W. A. Charlton of Norfolk County. There are 33 specific charges in the petition, in the petition, in which it is alleged from \$2 to \$5 was paid for votes, and there are a number of other charges. For the first time women figure in an election petition as having received money. One lady is mentioned as an agent for the distribution of funds, and seven women are alleged to have received money for their votes.

The last election petition was the cross-petition in South Bruce in South Bruce in December, 1914. There were five petitions following the elections of 1911, but none of them came to trial. The sum of \$1,000 is required to be paid into court with each petition.

In the present petition, J. Walter Barclay Township, Nelson S. Palmerton of Charlottetown township and Wilson Porter of Woodhouse township are the petitioners to void the election of Wm. A. Charlton, of Toronto, lumberman. It is set forth that at the election Charlton received 3,847 votes, whereas his opponent, J. A. Wallace, farmer, received 3,237.

The petition charges that personally or through Senator McCall, in the village of Delhi, Mr. Charlton paid or caused to be paid, to S. Stout, manager of the Dominion Canners, the sum of \$300 to be used for the purpose of corruptly influencing the election and was illegally used. They are set out a number of specific cases, in which voters are alleged to have received various sums to induce them to vote for the respondent, W. A. Charlton.

It is charged that through Adam Rose, in the township of Windham, \$50 was given to Clayton Hunter wherewith to buy votes for the respondent.

Sunday, December 16, the eve of the election, is said to have been the date upon which it is alleged Kenneth McCall, setting for Mr. Charlton, paid Harry Poole the sum of \$5.00.

The petition closes with the allegation: "That prior to the polling day, the respondent, W. A. Charlton, gave large sums of money to agents in the county of Norfolk for the purpose of corrupting the electors of the said county and procuring their support for the respondent at the coming election. The names of the person or persons to whom the respondent or agents paid the money are at present unknown to the petitioners.

The typewritten charges precede the usual election petition.

The above extract was taken from the London Advertiser of Monday, January 28th.

The Globe of the same date in reporting on the same case in concluding: "When asked to say if he would support the petition, Mr. Charlton said that he did not know, and that he would refer the matter to his lawyer."

It had read in the newspaper, "The election is not held at yet and it is not until the poll is taken that the result is known. He did not think it was a wise thing to say anything at all at that time."


