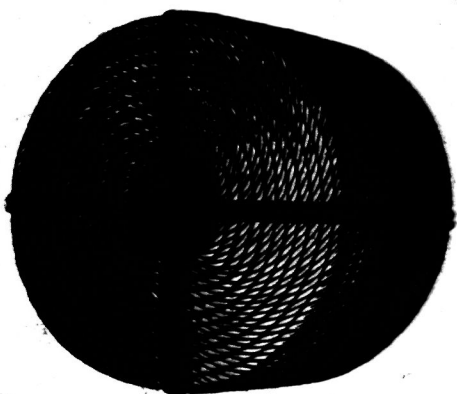

IN ENJOY IS STRENGTH

South American Republics Have an Ambitious Project.

Dr. Hipolito Irigoyen, President of the Argentine Republic, is a Radical, and the first Radical who has ever held the office he now occupies. Moreover, he is, perhaps, the most popular man in the public life of the country. Early last spring, when offered the nomination for the presidency by the Radical party, he positively declined, but, notwithstanding his protests, he was nominated and elected. Since then he has won over to his side a considerable share of the Conservative opinion of the country, apparently without forfeiting the loyalty of his original following. He tried that loyalty severely by taking a position counter to public opinion with reference to the Luxburg case, and by rejecting the first resolution of Congress calling for the severance of diplomatic relations between the republic and the German empire. While he is out of accord with the leader of the Radicals in the Chamber of Deputies, Senor Castellanos, he has been able to win the support of that able man to his ambitious project for the bringing of all the republics of South America into a defensive and offensive alliance on matters relating to the present world conflict.

Senor Castellanos has made it very plain that the desire of President Irigoyen is to impress, not only the Central Powers of Europe, but the allied nations and the United States, by presenting any plea or claim which the South American nations may have to put forward, either during the war or at its conclusion, in the name and with the backing of all of them. To what extent he has won sympathy or approval from neighboring republics for this project it is impossible to say, but numerous Pan-American conferences, in recent years, and the A. B. C. Conference in particular, have doubtless served to pave the way for joint action among these nations with respect to so important a matter as the European war.

There are many jealousies and conflicting interests to be considered, and some deep-rooted enmities, but in the face of a common menace, and with the promise of common protection and common reward, the negotiation of such an alliance as President Irigoyen has in contemplation cannot be pronounced impossible. It must be viewed as a reasonable proposition that the South American peoples, acting as a unit, would be able to obtain more consideration, from either friendly or unfriendly nations, than if they were acting without organization, without solidarity, and on their individual account. Separately, none of them has very much to offer that would either tempt or intimidate the greater powers; united, they would at once become an object of attention. This, it may be assumed, is how the situation is viewed by President Irigoyen and Senor Castellanos, and such a view may appear quite rational to leaders of public opinion in the other republics.

For humanity, there would be bound up with the success of the South American unification, scheme a great deal more than has ever been shown in any Pan-American enterprise. It might, that is, ultimate in the permanent organization of a great South American federation, a United States of South America, a great democracy, to reckon and to be reckoned with in the world re-adjustment that is near at hand.

Got Milk on Sunday

Tillsonburg, July 7.—Last Wednesday the patrons of the Borden Milk company held a meeting at Courtland to discuss the Sunday drawing milk, owing to circumstances resulting from war conditions and after much friendly discussion between prominent farmers and factory representatives, a resolution not to draw milk on Sunday was carried unanimously. But since the meeting apparently a new feeling has developed, as 65 per cent. of the daily average was delivered to-day, and in conversation with factory officials, patrons stated that they only wished the order had been put into effect years ago, as it saved them hours of work on Sunday storing milk to keep it the right temperature for Monday delivery, and after today's result it is expected that nearly the whole yield will be forthcoming next Sunday.

FALL WHEAT SEED

ANNOUNCEMENT

IN VIEW of the partial failure of the Fall Wheat Crop in this Province this year it will be necessary for farmers to make early arrangements for the supply of seed which they will need for fall sowing. Under these circumstances farmers who have on hand quantities of wheat suitable for fall seeding are urged to conserve them for this purpose. If there is no demand locally, the information should be supplied to this Department or to the local Office of this Department in your County so that every may be made to have an equitable and satisfactory distribution. The need for foodstuffs justifies a large acreage of Fall Wheat in this province again this year, and the co-operation of the farmers in the mobilization and distribution of the available seed supplies is invited.

Was There Foul Play

Simcoe, July 7.—The body of the late Frank Henry Kitchen, aged forty years, who was last seen alive on May 28, when he left Tapscott for his home near Waterford late at night and having on his person considerable money, and for whose whereabouts diligent search had been made, was found yesterday by his brother, Ernest, lying close by a rear boundary fence between two farms fronting opposite concessions, and immediately west of the centre of his own "string" hundred. One hundred and eight dollars in bills and some silver were found in the clothing. The body had been reduced to a skeleton and integument.

Detectives have worked on the case for weeks, expecting foul play, and one of these is reported to have said: "Produce the body and I will produce the man."

Coroner Teeter, of Watford, called Dr. McGillvary, of Simcoe, to make notified Crown Attorney Slaght. A jury of neighbors was sworn in, visited the place where the man was found, viewed the body in the farm barn, and adjourned until next Saturday to meet at Watford.

Kitchen was an industrious and apparently intelligent farmer, who was from all appearance making good and improving his property. It is said that his wife did not spend much of her time about home; was away when he disappeared, and had arrived on the farm on Friday night with a consort.

At a patriotic meeting called for that purpose, the medal awarded to Private Wesley Ashford for bravery on the field, was presented to Mr. Chas. Ashford, father of the young hero at the Princess Theatre, Port Rowan, on Tuesday evening, July 2.

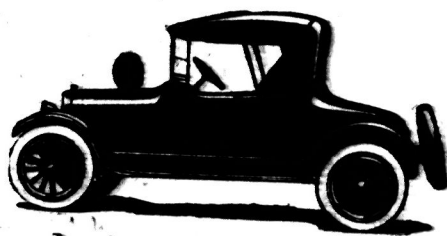
