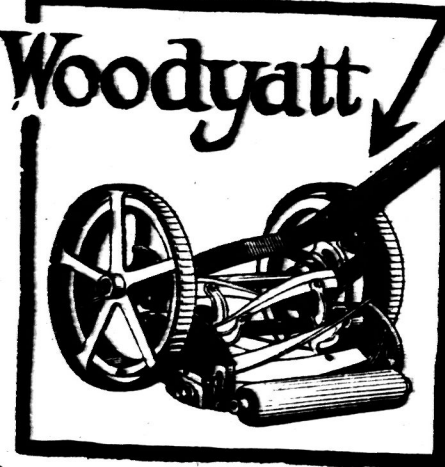

### County Council

Smelser-Buckley—That the Clerk be instructed to give the names of all the auctioneers who have taken out licenses for the county of Haldimand for the year 1918, and report at the next meeting of the Council. carried.

Bradford-Lyons—That the report of the Building committee be received and read. carried.

To the Warden and Councillors of the County Council:

Gentlemen—We your Building committee, have examined the Court House and would recommend the windows on the outside be repainted and painted, the buildings at the House of Refuge is now being done under the supervision of Mr. Brown and is progressing satisfactory. The hauling of the material is being done by the home team. We would recommend that the wall in the judge's room be taken down and be fixed for Mr. Eccles as an office.

Doyle-Houser—That the report of the Building committee be adopted as read. carried.

Smith-Wilton—That the County of Haldimand county recommend that in view of the partial failure of the fall wheat crop and the prospective scarcity of seed, that this Council notify the Minister of Agriculture for Canada to take steps to allow good fall wheat in farmer's hands to be distributed for seed purposes; that steps be taken to ensure a sufficient seed supply and that instead of one supply centre that two or more centres be established in the county, and that a copy be sent to the Minister. carried.

McQuillan-Pyle—That we do now adjourn for the several committees to meet. carried.

Smelser-Buckley—That weresume business with the Warden in the Warden in the chair. carried.

Buckley-Holland—That the report of the Good Roads committee be received and read. carried.

To the Warden and Members of the County Council:

Gentlemen—We, your Good Roads committee beg leave to re-as follows:

1. We have examined the construction and maintenance accounts presented by the Superintendent and recommend them for payment.
2. Division 23—Road no. 2 has been graded from the end of the metal to the county of Wentworth.
3. We have eight grading outfits now working on the clay section of the county road system and we hope with favorable weather to be able to grade and drain the greater part of our clay roads before the busy season sets in.
4. There is an experienced man and a keeper over our bridges and culverts, examining them carefully and doing the necessary repairs.
5. We are shipping stone from Vinemount to Dunnville to repair Divisions 39 and 40, Road 14.
6. The Superintendent made an arrangement with Mr. R. Hambleton to furnish men to operate his quarry at Hagersville. The venture has proven very satisfactory, making a considerable saving to the county. The stone is used for repairing divisions 18, 3, 19, 15, 14, 16, 7, and 11. Teams are used to haul the stone for a distance of 5 miles and under from the quarry; greater distances the Case tractor and traction cars are used.
7. We have the invoice for the car of Tarvia for Divisions 23 and 30, but the car has not yet arrived.
8. That we employ Mr. Andrew Winger to build a 5-span cement culvert on Division 12, Road No. 7, opposite George Fess' farm and pay him by the day and supply him with what additional help he may require and also all material.
9. That the chairman, and Mr. Smithith and the Superintendent be given power to fix the price and to sell the hoists and all attachments at the Nelles Corners' Quarry.
10. That the twp. of Walpole may hire the Case tractor and cars to haul stone, providing the county is not using them, at rate of \$10 day they to furnish fuel and oil and pay our engineer and helper the same wages as the county.
11. Would recommend that the account of W. Harrop for \$10.27 for damages to his automobile on div. 23 be paid.

## HERE IS THE DAY YOU REGISTER

ON June 22nd, Saturday, every man and woman, resident in Canada, who is 16 years and over, must attend at one of the

places provided for registration, between the hours of 7 a.m. and 10 p.m., and there truthfully answer all the questions set forth upon the registration card. Upon signing the card, vouching for the accuracy of the answers, the man or woman will receive a Registration Certificate, as shown below, which must be carried upon the person thereafter.

### Why the Certificate is so Important

For failure to register a maximum fine of \$100 and one month's imprisonment is provided, also an added penalty of \$10 for each day the person remains unregistered after June 22nd.

Persons remaining unregistered cannot lawfully be employed, and cannot draw wages for work done after June 22nd. Employers who keep unregistered persons in their employ will be liable for fines equal in amount to those recoverable from the unregistered employees.

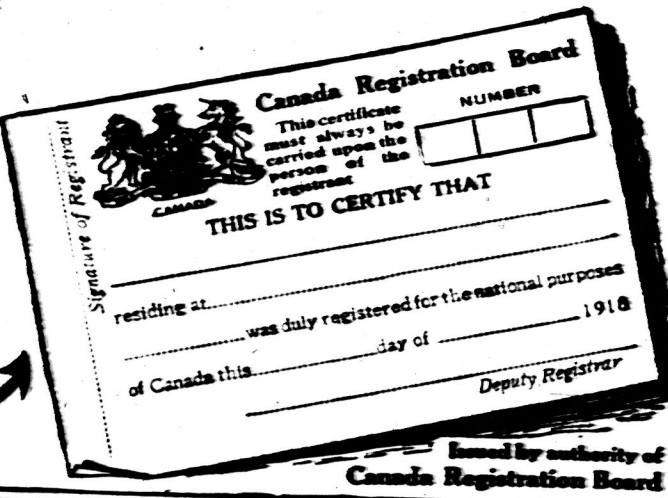
Unregistered persons cannot lawfully purchase transportation tickets, and may find themselves

barred from travelling on railroads, steamboats, etc. Similarly they may be denied board and lodging at any hotel, restaurant, public house or boarding house.

In a word—All persons remaining unregistered, and all persons having dealings with unregistered persons, knowing them to be such, incur heavy penalties under the law.

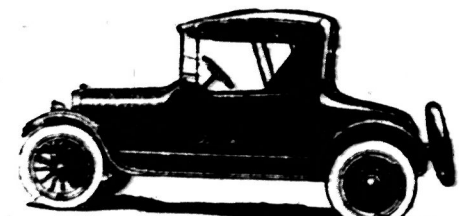
