"This war has been a great discoverer; especially has it revealed facts regarding food. What is the healthful part of a beef, a calf, a sheep or a hog to eat? Give it up? The answer is: Brains!"

In Hamilton the old day, Dr. Ramsay told a representative gathering of citizens that brains are the most healthful food product of an animal. He had spent his life in examining meat, and had never seen a diseased brain of an edible animal. He did not go so far as to say that if you ate animal brains you would grow in mental stature but he declared animal brains made a perfect, healthful food, and any man with brains would take his tip and start eating animal's brains.

Of course, the British born have known this truth, and practised it for generations, but because it was a good thing they didn't pass it along, and the ordinary Canadian now finds out he has been overlooking the one best brain in the matter of meat foods.

Dr. Ramsay let out the secret relative to animal brains, and at the same time opened the cupboard door on other nutritious, epicurean tid-bits, long enjoyed with ecstasy by old country-men, but concealed from the native born. He said that if there was a greater consumption to brains, livers,

can be studied at about 19c a lb. Down drops the cost of living at once, and up goes Canada's contributions to the food supplies of the Allies. If Canadian consumers know a good thing to eat when they see it, and desire to help win this war with their teeth and their stomachs.

**Altered War Words.**

An examination of modern military terms reveals the fact that very few of them possess the meaning originally assigned to them. Munitions, for example, in ancient times signified not only the materials of warfare, but also the fixed defences of an army. Thus the translators of the authorized version of the Bible use the phrase "munition of rocks" to translate "impregnable rock fortresses," and the defending army is charged to keep the munitions when the meaning is "guard the fortresses." Carriage is another word with a changed meaning. In Acts appears the phrase "We took up our carriages." It is one Greek word meaning "having packed up," and the Geneva version (1557) has "we trussed up our fardels." In those days the word's meaning was "something carried," not as now, "something that carries."—London Chronicle.

**Bait for Fishing.**

A fish hasn't a nose, but it can smell. Recent experiments have proved this. Anglers has laid so much stress on the need of exciting a fish's interest by the look of food that the effect of scent has been overlooked. A shark will bite at a hook containing a piece of fat pork, although the pork does not look like any kind of fish that swims in the sea.

It may be heresy in angling to suggest that a "fly" should smell like a fish. These scientific experiments show how large a part small smells play in the food pursuit of fish. Bait, such as small crabs, was found and eaten by the fishes two or three times as rapidly when the shells were broken. Bait placed inside a gauze bag was smelled within three minutes of being lowered in the water, and almost at the same time all the fishes began nibbling at the bag. When cotton was stuffed into its so-called "nostrils" the dogfish would seldom observe the food that came near them.—Chicago Herald.

**Lizard Squirts Blood From Eyes.**

We have about 14 species of horned lizards in this country, and most people still call them "horned toads." Some of their habits are extremely remarkable, but none more so than their ability to send at will a fine jet of blood from their eye. This fact is very rarely touched upon in literature, and the average reader of the life histories of our animals has never heard of this remarkable habit, says a writer in the Popular Science Monthly, in an article entitled "A Lizard that Squirts Jets of Blood From Its Eyes."

Blood-squirting is generally indulged in when the lizard is laboring under certain states of excitement. The attack comes on suddenly, at a time when you have the lizard in your grasp. It will suddenly stiffen its neck and throw the head upward, as the eyes bulge from their sockets. In answer second you can plainly hear a peculiar hissing sound, followed immediately by the finest imaginable jet of pure blood from one or the other of its eyes. With such force is this squirted that the tiny stream, lasting a couple of seconds, may be thrown to a distance of fully five feet.

**MECCA THE MYSTIC.**

Capital of the New Kingdom of Arabia.

A striking picture of Mecca the Mystic, capital of the new kingdom within Arabia which was established recently by the grand sheriff of the Moslem faith, is contained in a communication to the U. S. National Geographic Society from Dr. S. M. Zwerner. A part of the communication has been issued by the society as the following was geography bulletin:

"Of all the provinces of Arabia, El-Hedjaz, which recently revolted against Turkish rule and set up its own kingdom, with the grand sheriff of Mecca as sovereign, undoubtedly has most frequent contact with the outside world, yet is the least known. Parts of it have never yet been explored.

"El Hedjaz is so named because it forms the barrier between Tehama, the coast province on the south, and Nejd in the interior. Its sole importance is due to the fact that it contains the two sacred cities, Mecca and Medina, which for more than 13 centuries have been the centres of pilgrimage for the Moslem world.

**Aged French Air Warrior Has Great Record.**

Paris, June 13.—Adjutant Moutren departed the tenth German machine on June 7 as it was attacking an observation balloon. Moutren enlisted in the infantry at the beginning of the war, although 60 years of age, and two years later passed into the aviation service. His first victory was won on April 20, 1917, twenty days after his arrival at the front as a pilot. It was Moutren who shot down the German aeroplane piloted by "Farmanas," the would-be bugaboo of the Allies. This German used to cross the trenches just at dawn, firing upon outposts, supply trains and anything else moving at that hour.

**HUGE DEBT OF BRITAIN**

Now Four Times Greater Than Ever Before.

Every Six Months Adds \$3,750,000,000.

Before the war Great Britain's debt amounted to \$5,525,000,000, and it has been increased through the war by \$15,000,000,000. Every six months of war adds another net increase of \$3,750,000,000. By Christmas, 1917, therefore, the national debt amounted to about \$450 per head of the whole population of the United Kingdom.

Britain's national debt is over 300 years old. Its nucleus was laid in 1692, William III. found it difficult to raise money by taxation for his wars. In the year mentioned the first step was taken in the authorization by Parliament of a loan of \$5,000,000. Ministers grew bolder, and at William's death the debt was about \$80,000,000. During the reign of Anne the famous victories of Marlborough raised it to \$270,000,000. Under George I it was reduced by \$10,000,000, but the Spanish, French and German wars of George II. added \$150,000,000, and at the conclusion of peace in 1763, in the reign of George III, the debt amounted to \$695,000,000.

In 1775 began the American War of independence, when the independence of United States was acknowledged, in 1783 the debt had risen to \$1,250,000,000, and after Waterloo it stood at \$4,500,000,000. During the next 40 years \$500,000,000 was cleared off. The Crimean War added \$1,500,000,000. The \$4,000,000,000 at which the debt stood in 1865 was more than four times the amount which Bismarck had said implied disaster and collapse. Yet the nation was in a more flourishing condition commercially than it had been at any previous period of its history. By this time, also it had become generally held that the only practicable method of liquidating or reducing the debt was by raising a revenue larger than that required to meet the expenditure, and by applying the surplus to the actual paying off of debt.
