We are glad to report that all of the aforementioned cases are improving nicely. The local Board of Health, which met in conjunction with the Council last evening, has not, as yet, decided to open the Churches on Sunday next. However, a meeting is to be held on Friday evening next when a decision will be arrived at, and the result posted up in the Postoffice and the Telephone central. In the township the epidemic seems to be abating and the Board of Health have decided to allow the schools to re-open on Monday next. The Board would suggest, however, that in sections where there is illness in school families the Trustees keep the schools closed another week.
