1 The accounts for construction and maintenance presented by the Superintendent have been examined carefully and recommend them for payment.

2 The Committee, accompanied by Mr. Muir, Engineer from the Department of Public Highways, and the Superintendent made a tour of inspection of all work done on the County Highways System, and Township of Sherbrook. We found that the whole of the clay I Re letter from Menard Motor section had been graded and drain-Six miles of the Macadam sections have been resurfaced, and ten miles repaired; this puts the Macadam road all in good shape. 
