

## **THE SOLDIER** PRIEST (By Capt. J. A. F. Ozanne.)

It has been with a deep and a heartfelt sorrow that his friends have read in the casualty list among the killed, the name of Lieutenant Colonel B. W. Vann, D.S.O., M.C., of the Sherwood Foresters. His friends were many, for in addition to those who knew and respected him as a brave and dashing officer, there were also those who knew and loved him as a priest.

Without a doubt Bernard Vann was a magnificent example of a soldierpriest, for he possessed in no small degree the essential qualities for bota the profession of the soldier and the backey blue at Cambridge) he seemed cut out for the military life. But at the same time, he possessed with these robuster gifts the deeper and more spiritual charismata of a zeal for souls, a tenderness of character and a passionate belief in the goodness of


human nature. He was ordained deacon in 1910 to the parish of St. Barnabas. New Humberstone, and was priested in the following year. He remained until 1915, when he joined the army as a coma sufficient to say that within three years he rose to the rank of lieutenant-Colonel, won the distinguished service order once, and the military cross twice. The charm of his persongaging raconteur, ever ready with inenedible stories—endeared him to all in his regiment, where he was known a sterling pricet, always ready to celeity occurred, and ever willing to help the padre in every possible way.

Season to taste with salt and paprika. Moisten with a French or vinagrette dressing (to which has been added a pinch of curry powder) and serve on a salad platter surrounded with a border

Add to one large cupful of cooked notato cubes one-quarter of a cupful of diced cooked carrots, one tablespoonful of chopped parsley, one slice of minced white onion and haif a chopped pickled beet. Season to taste with salt and paprika, moisten with a mayonnaise dressing to which a slice of minced pickle has been added and serve on a bed of crisp romaine or lettuce.
