Building—Holliday—that the report of the Printing and Insurance Committee be received and read, carried.
Cayuga, Sept. 25, 1918.
To the Warden and Members of the County Council:

Gentlemen—We, your Printing and Insurance Committee, beg to report as follows:

1. Re: Insurance on House of Refuges. Three policies fall due in August, viz., the Royal, \$2,000, Pacific Coast \$2,000, and the National Union \$2,000, making a total of \$6,000, and your committee have insured the same in one policy, viz., the Royal, which we recommend to the Finance Committee for the payment of the premium, \$96.

2. We have also placed an additional insurance on the barn at the House of Refuge of \$600 implement building \$200, contents of same \$300, contents of barn \$600, with Mr. J. W. Sheppard, the Mercantile Co., policy no. 245114, premium \$41; also renewed the policy for the pumping plant in the Mercantile Co., policy no. 4365, with J. W. Sheppard, premium \$6.

All of which we recommend to the Finance committee for payment.

McQuillan-Pyle—that the report of the Good Roads Committee be received and read, carried.
To the Warden and Members of the County Council:

Gentlemen—We, your Good Road Committee beg leave to report as follows:

1. We have examined the construction and maintenance accounts presented by the Superintendent and recommend them for payment.

2. Arrangements have been made with the Michigan Central Railroad to supply the County Good Road System with what screening we may require from their quarry at Hagersville at \$1.00 per yard, the County to do the loading into their wagons.

3. The committee appointed to examine the double arch culvert, opposite the farm of Mr. Hiram Gee, Div. Road no. 7, reported as follows: They looked the whole situation over carefully, and recommended that the Superintendent have the Clay obstructed on the north side of the culvert removed, also any obstructions on the south side. By doing this they thought it would improve conditions considerably, and also recommended that at the December meeting of the Council a suggestion be made to the Council of 1918 to take the double arch culvert out and replace it with a reinforced concrete bridge, giving a 22 ft. waterway and a 22 foot roadway.

4. The complaint of Mr. Moodie of Canfield re ditch in front of store have instructed the Superintendent to see Mr. Moodie and report at the next meeting.

5. The account of Tillman Dennis for damages to tires was laid over till next meeting.

6. The communication of R. S. Colter re maintenance of roads of roads through the village of Cayuga connecting up road no. 1; no action was taken.

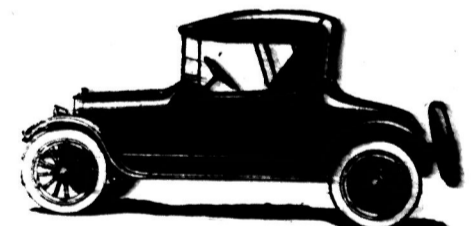
