If the war were to end to-morrow i would probably cast \$250,000,000 to demobilize the Canadian soldiers. For Canada's Expeditionary Force Pay and Allowances alone amount to \$14,000,000 a month, whether the men are fighting

Of the \$500,000,000 desired through the Victors Loan, this year's war bill will be equal to four-fifths of it.

Bear in mind that a large portion of the money received through the Victory Loan will go to finance sales of Canada' products to Britain.
