County Council Cont'd.

Holland-Buckley—That the report of the Home committee be received and read.

To the Warden and Members of the County Council: Gentlemen—We, your Home committee have met and examined the accounts for maintenance and find them correct, and would refer the same to the Finance committee for payment.

There are thirty-three inmates in the Home, 20 males and 13 females, an increase of one since the last report, Dunken McArthur, from Selkirk, admitted by Mr. C. Smelser.

We have a request from the Home physician for an increase of salary which we wish to refer to the whole council for consideration. Respectfully submitted, H. J. Pyle, chairman.

Hudspeth-McCarter—That the report of Home committee be adopted as read, carried.

Smelser-Buckley—That the county council grant the sum of \$50.00 to Thomas Walsh for to beautify the Court House grounds for this year. Carried.

Bradford-McCarter—That we do now adjourn and go into the committee of the Whole with Mr. Hudspeth as chairman. Carried.

Pyle-Bradford—That the council of the whole adjourn and the Warden take the chair. Carried.

Pyle-Sawle—That a by-law be passed fixing Dr. Pringle's salary at \$200 per annum, and the same be read a first time and that by-law no. 468 be repealed. Carried.

Alford-McCarter—That the report of the committee of the Whole be received and read. Carried.

We have examined the auditors' report for 1918 and recommend its adoption so far as the County accounts and the House of Refuge accounts are concerned.

All of which is respectfully submitted. W. W. WILSON, Chairman.

Clark-Holland—That we adopt the finance report as read. Carried.

Bradford-Pyle—That the Sheriff be instructed to procure a pair of hand cuffs for Mr. Joseph Egan. Carried.

Tooley-Wilton—That the County of Haldimand make the usual grant of \$15 to the Ontario Good Roads Association. Carried.

Buckley-Holland—That the report of the Good Roads committee be received and read. Carried.

Cayuga, March 28, 1919. To the Warden and Members of the County Council:

Gentlemen—We, your Good Roads committee, beg leave to report as follows:

1 We have examined the maintenance and construction accounts submitted by the Superintendent and would recommend them for payment.

2 We met at Caledonia on the 14th inst. and prepared estimates of expenditure on the county highway system for 1919 as follows:

Provincial county roads, maintenance... \$85,000 00

County Roads, maintenance... 5,000 00

County Roads, construction... 40,000 00

\$130,000 00

A detailed estimate of expenditure on each road and division with the kind of work is attached herewith.

Propose building the following Mac-Adam roads with the two outfalls belonging to the county (including two stone crushers):

Road No. 1—commencing at the village of Cayuga and going west four miles to end of metal.

Road No. 10—From Nelles' Corners to Fisherville side road.

Road No. 7—commencing at the village of Selkirk (Rainham road) and going north 4 1/2 miles.

Road No. 11—From end of metal to boundary between Dunn and South Cayuga.

And travelling road no. 17 from village of Cayuga to village of Caledonia.

1 That we ask for tenders for hauling, rolling and sprinkling crushed stone and screenings on road no. 2, approximately 13 miles as follows:—commencing at village of Jarvis and going north 4 miles; commencing at first line of Onondaga Township and going north 7 miles to village of Caledonia; commencing at Westworth boundary and going south to the end of metal, distance two miles.

That we accept the offer of Alfred Knisley to operate the Nelles' Corners quarry and our solicitor be asked to draw up an agreement for him to sign.

6 That we accept the offer of Alfred Best to operate quarries close to road no. 7 and our Solicitor be requested to sign.

7 That we recommend that the County Highways account be opened in Dunnville branch of the Union Bank of Canada and that the clerk be asked to prepare a by-law authorizing the borrowing of seventy-five thousand dollars for the improvement of the county highways for the year 1919, from the above bank.

8 Would recommend that the special grant to Sherbrook be spent on R. R. roads.

9 That the Superintendent be authorized to paint the machinery and also railings on approaches to bridges and culverts.

10 That permission be given the village of Byng to put a cement crossing across our highway passing through the village.

11 That Walter Holland be given permission to place a gasoline pump in the south side of the county highway in South Cayuga village.

12 That By-law no. 377 be repealed and owing to increased duties of Superintendent that his travelling expenses be allowed in new By-law, commencing Jan. 1st, 1918.

13 That the treasurer be authorized to issue check for \$440 in favor of the Seneca Lumber Co. when receiving distribution account sheet signed by Warden and Superintendent.

14 That the clerk be asked to reply to Mr. McConnell's communication re letting of roads by contract.

15 That the Department of Public Highways has advised us that an order in-council dated Feb. 19, 1919, authorized the payment of the sum of \$8,880.75 as a Provincial subsidy on the expenditure on county roads during 1918, and Treasurer reports that cheque covering above amount has been received.

16 That the Treasurer be advised to procure a distribution ledger same as used in Superintendent's office so as to make a uniformity in the keeping of the provincial and county roads accounts and enable him to comply with section 27 of the Highway Improvement Act.

17 That the Warden and Chairman of this committee be asked to assist and advise the Superintendent in all matters
