Mathews Canada Makes Strong Hit

(TORONTO TRIP REPORT)

Trade conditions in Canada were never better than at the present time, says J. L. Ackert, sales manager of the National Sales Company, Hamilton, Ontario. This encouraging report is the result of a most successful trip to the west coast. Mr. Ackert's recent campaign has been the western outlook, especially for the motor truck business. His trip, which lasted five weeks, was successful in establishing National truck branches in some of the largest automobile centers in the principal western cities, and reports of over a quarter of a million dollars worth of National trucks which will be shipped as fast as they can be built.

The western people are strong for the National truck, says Mr. Ackert. The feeling is that, providing the Canadian article has equal merit to the imported competitive product, there is no reason why Canada should not come first. How far they are willing to go in this direction was demonstrated by the fact that all the largest dealers in the west were anxious to handle the Canadian truck in preference to the American makes. Their judgement is based upon sound common sense as well as loyalty to Canada, says Mr. Ackert, for the National is built by Canadians in a Canadian plant especially to meet Canadian conditions. In Saskatchewan the National representatives are the Smith Motor truck Sales Co. Limited. In Winnipeg, the Western Canada Motor Co. Limited. In Vancouver, the Signore Motor Co. Limited.

The Calgary representatives will be Messrs. Peacock and Lesson, and a garage and service station to take care of National trucks exclusively, costing \$40,000, is being erected in that city.

After giving up business here he operated his farm just south of the village for a number of years. Of late years he has resided with his several daughters.

The pall-bearers were his son, J. B. McMicken; three sons-in-law, James Bush, Wm. Norris, and Wm. Turner; J. C. Bush and J. J. Parsons.

He is survived by one son, James, of this place, and four daughters, Mrs. J. A. Bush, Walpole; Mrs. Barber, Detroit; Mrs. Wm. Turner, Detroit; and Mrs. Wm. Norris, of Fort William.
