War in Germany

New York, July 31.—Building Red Triangle huts in the ex-kaiser's front yard is an occupation viewed with keen enjoyment by the doughboys, according to Harry Y. Patton, No. 136 West Oak wood place, Buffalo, just returned home twelve months' service overseas.

"Pop" Patton has been engaged in the construction department of the Y.M.C.A. in France and Germany. He said that when the army of occupation moved into Germany, the Y.M.C.A. anticipated the urgent need of new buildings in which to continue its welfare-recreation work, obtained immediate permission and erected the now famous Liberty and Victory huts on the grounds on the Kaiser's palace at Coblenz.

"One was a cafeteria, complete with the finest stoves and cooking utensils," he said, "capable of feeding 5,000 men at a time. German cooks, waiters and helpers were employed."

"The other was a huge auditorium, seating 2,000 men, equipped for boxing, theatricals and all sorts of entertainment. Every afternoon and evening performances were given before packed houses."

The Y.M.C.A. built and operated thirty-two buildings in the vicinity of Coblenz alone, exclusive of the famous Fest-Halle, supplied by the city and where the dough boys says there was "always something doing." For the most part German labor was employed, army engineers assisting the staff of Red Triangle architects and contractors.

Mr. and Mrs. Patton visited at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Wm. Sower of this village last week. Mrs. Patton is a niece of Mr. Sower, and daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. James Elmer of Buffalo and formerly of this town.

Selkirk Lady Drowned

Rheta Miller, aged 22 years, a switchboard operator at the General Y. M. C. A., Toronto, who was staying at the Bishop Evans' camp, succumbed to an attack of heart failure while swimming in Muslemann's Lake. Miss Miller sank suddenly when within a few yards of a raft anchored at a short distance from shore, but considerable time elapsed before her body was recovered, and when Dr. Herbert Fred arrived he found that nothing could be done to restore life. Miss Miller's home was at Selkirk, Ont., and while in Toronto resided on Dundas-street east.
