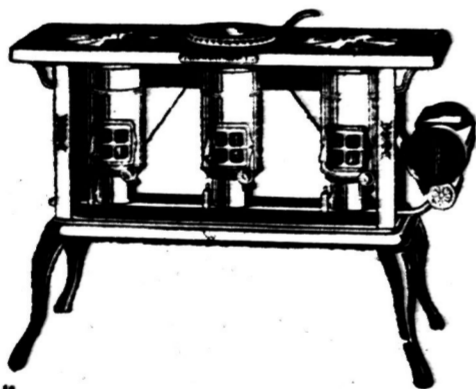

**Werner Stringer Chosen as W. F. O. Candidate at Sayuga**

Cayuga, Aug. 26.—At the U. F. O. convention for Haldimand County held here to day, Werner Stringer of Canboro Township, was chosen by acclamation as county candidate in the provincial election. The candidate was born in Canboro 54 years ago and but for three years as a public school teacher has spent his life on the farm.

The nomination was unanimous and was received with cheers as Mr. Stringer is considered in every way a good people's man. In a few remarks he said that if the farmers would fling politics to the winds and stand on their soil platform, they would go forward to victory and prove themselves to be the noblemen of the country. He thanked the convention for the honor they had extended to him and if defeated would willingly stand a second time.

W. G. Clark, S. A. Beck and R. E. King were also nominated, but declined. Previous to nomination the convention was addressed by M. W. Doherty, U. F. O. candidate for Peel County. Mr. Doherty spoke for nearly two hours and held the attention of his audience by his splendid address. He urged upon the U. F. O. electors to drop politics, as the farmers were the only class which was a slave of the party and which took politics seriously.

All other parties used politics to a commercial end. He claimed that politics is a tangle of lies and that to win their end they must organize. His chief contention was that the farmers must keep clear of party politics and form a party of their own in the interests of all classes. The enormous debt of Canada must be paid from the soil and under present conditions the farms were becoming depopulated.

The weather was ideal and the attendance very large, the courthouse being crowded.
