

HISTORY OF ANARCHISM

The First of the French Anarchists was a Russian.

The modern cause for the destruction of private property and of government persons by the throwing of bombs and the planting of dynamite machines owes its origin to a world-wide movement to the Russian anarchist, Mikhail Bakounin.

Born of aristocratic parents, Mikhail Bakounin at first was an officer in the Russian army. Later, disgusted by the suffering and oppression of the poor by the Government, he resigned his commission and studied Marxian philosophy. Coming to revolutionary circles in Germany and mainly under the influence of Arnold Ruge, who represented the extreme Hegelian Left, Bakounin took part in the Dresden insurrection of 1848.

He was arrested and condemned to death, but eventually handed over to the Russians and imprisoned in Schlusselburg, and in 1853 sent to Siberia. He later escaped to Japan, then came to the United States; and in 1861 Bakounin, preaching revolution, appeared in London, where he founded a school of anarchism. In 1872 he was expelled from the Socialist party because of his militant anarchism. In 1876 he died, leaving a large number of followers ready to carry on his work.

The first attempt to carry out his teachings was made by his followers in 1878 upon the life of Emperor Wilhelm I of Germany. Later two attempts were made to kill the King of Spain. In 1882 Bakounin's teachings were adopted by the French anarchists and for the first time dynamite was used.

The number of anarchistic societies was growing rapidly. On September 23, 1893, at Barcelona, Spain, many persons were killed by a bomb buried into a crowd at a military parade by a Spanish anarchist. Six anarchists were executed. A short time after the foregoing bomb outrage an unknown anarchist hurled a bomb into the pit of a Barcelona theatre, killing thirty and wounding eighty. This was anarchism's largest single bomb crop.

Just before the guillotine's blade severed his head from his body the anarchist cried, "Vive l'Anarchisme!"

The bomb epidemic next reached Italy. More than 2,500 anarchists were arrested there. Anarchists spread rapidly in Italy, Spain, France, Austria, Germany and Russia.

The first anarchist outbreak in the United States was at the Haymarket, Chicago, on May 4, 1886. A bomb was thrown when policemen attempted to disperse a gathering of strikers. Seven persons were killed and sixty wounded.

At San Francisco on July 22, 1916, a suitcase bomb exploded among a crowd watching the preparedness parade. Ten persons were killed and forty wounded. Tom Mooney, accused of helping to plant this bomb, was convicted and now is in prison.

On May 1, 1919, thirty-two persons were discovered in the New York City post office addressed to prominent Americans, after the explosion of one addressed to Senator Hardwick, of Georgia.

Alexander Berkman at the outset tried the Bakounin method. He later was arrested for attempted murder and imprisoned. Emma Goldman, Berkman's partner, who preached the anarchist doctrine of violence, now is serving time in a Federal prison for violating the espionage act.
